Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The charity is an unincorporated charity, registered in England. It was registered on 20 June 2023.

Appointment of trustees

The charity's committee has regular meetings throughout the year to plan activities and monitor progress of its initiatives. Membership of the management committee is open to all parents, guardians and carers of children attending the school. Trustees / members of the committee are elected at the AGM and hold office until the following AGM. The AGM takes place a few weeks after the start of the school year (in late September or early October). There must be a minimum of two trustees.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

To advance the education of pupils in the school by:

- developing effective relationships between the staff, parents / carers and others associated with the school;
- engaging in activities or providing facilities or equipment which support the schools and advance the education of the pupils.

Activities

The charity supports Cheam Common Infants' Academy (CCI) and Cheam Common Junior Academy (CCJ) through organising fund-raising events which serve multiple purposes: raising money to allow the schools to purchase necessary resources and equipment, increasing the engagement of all stakeholders to help improve the communication between the school and parents/carers in order to lead to better outcomes for the children, and providing fun activities for the students.

Achievements and Performance

During the 2024/2025 school year, across the various events the charity hosted, it generated an income of just over £65,468. The funds raised were allocated to a number of exciting projects for the schools.

Among other things, the charity helped the schools to procure:

- MUGA fencing
- MUGA basketball hoops
- MUGA shelter
- MUGA groundwork
- CCJ sports kit
- Table tennis tables
- Coats for winter campaign
- Rekenrek beads
- Grass blocks

- CCI playground renovation
- Climbing frame
- Fencing for reception
- Walkie talkies
- Infants canopy
- 7 large tables for events

The charity also supported the school through hosting and providing volunteers for a number of events, to offer opportunities to the parents and teachers of the school to come together, or as fund-raising events. Some examples of these included:

- a coffee morning;
- support on sports days;
- a general knowledge quiz evening;
- a bingo night;
- a summer fair.

Financial review

Our main source of funding is donations received from parents at the schools or from the local community. Our fundraising efforts this year have concentrated on the purchase of the items listed above, as well as completing the fundraising for the largest project the Friends of Cheam Common has worked on, namely the resurfacing and refencing of the Multi Use Game Area (MUGA) at Cheam Common Junior Academy (CCJ). Due to the scale of the project, the Trustees applied for a variety of grants from the wider community and engaged even more closely with parents within the school to identify alternative sources of funding, rather than rely solely on donations received in the course of the usual activities hosted by the charity. We are pleased to report that this resulted in the receipt of corporate match-funding amounting to nearly £24,000. The project was successfully completed in 2025. Due to the success of the fundraising efforts over the year, we were also able to fund the renovation of the Cheam Common Infants' Academy playground.

The accounts for Friends of Cheam Common Academy are prepared on a receipts and payments basis. The total fundraising income for the year is £65,468, costs amount to £78,024, of which £63,234 is donations made to CCI and CCJ for the items listed above. This results in a net deficit for the year of £12,556. The cash position at the end of the financial year was a healthy balance of £56,763.

Reserves policy

The Trustees discuss the year's planning at the AGM and liaise with the schools throughout the year to discuss what items and projects they would like us to support them with. These requests are reviewed on a case by case basis. This is to ensure that donations made from the charity to the schools meet the threshold for providing a benefit to the majority of the school. It is also so that we can control what expenditure the charity is committing to. As we do not have access to credit facilities, it is key for the Trustees to ensure that any expenditure commitment can be met by existing cash assets. This is reviewed on an ongoing basis throughout the year so it can be adjusted according to the fundraising income the charity receives.

Plans for future period

The trustees intend to continue supporting the schools with the purchase of key equipment. For the academic year 2025/2026, we will support the schools with the development of a dedicated art studio. This will be used as a space to store art supplies and teach art lessons, minimising time lost to set up and clear classrooms for art activities and maximising the children's time to create and enjoy art activities. During the course of the year, other projects are likely to be funded also, to be identified with the senior leadership team throughout the year.
