### Introduction

The Trustees present their report and unaudited accounts for the period 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024

GrandFriends: The Company of Elders was launched in September 2022. Our financial year runs to 31<sup>st</sup> March. Therefore, this first set of accounts covers activity from September 2022 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024. The charity was incorporated 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 as a CIO.

### Objectives

The object of the CIO is *“for the public benefit, to relieve the needs of primarily but not exclusively young and elderly people in Bath and North East Somerset and the surrounding area, who are experiencing loneliness by reason of their age, disability, ill health or some other reason, through social interaction between older volunteers and younger people”*.

### Activities

GrandFriends: The Company of Elders trains and supports our volunteers who we value as Elders and as community assets. Our Mission is to address intergenerational loneliness by creating mutually beneficial connections between GrandFriends and people of all younger generations through our innovative programmes, thereby building more cohesive communities with elders at the heart.

### Finance

In the period to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024, income of the charity was £27,000:

- £10,000 from a private philanthropic collective
- £6,000 from an anonymous individual donor
- £5,000 from St John's Foundation, Bath
- £5,000 from Quartet Community Foundation
- £1,000 from Bath Hospital Cricket Club Fund.

The trustees are confident the charity will be able to meet outgoings in the rest of the financial year, through continuing and new support from donors and grant makers, to whom we are most grateful.

Reserves at the year-end amount to £1,770. As this is the first year since inception of the charity, it will take some time to build up reserves. There are no fixed outgoings at present and expenditure is only incurred when there is sufficient funding in place. PAYE will be established with employment contracts to all staff as of August 2024

### Structure, Governance & Management

The Charity is registered with the Charity Commission, number 1203669, as a CIO (Foundation).

The Charity's governing document is the Constitution, adopted on 5th December 2022.



## INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS REPORT

21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024

I report to the trustees on my examination of the financial statements of GrandFriends (the charity) for the period 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024 (incorporating activity since September 2022).

### Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's accounts carried out under section 145 of the Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.

### Independent examiner's statement

I have completed my examination. I confirm that no material matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:

1. accounting records were not kept in respect of the charity as required by section 130 of the Act; or
2. the accounts do not accord with those records

Although the charity's position at the period end of 31 March 2024 shows low reserves, we draw your attention to the trustees explanation that as this is the first year of the charity since inception, it will take some time to build reserves. New funding is actively sought and reasonable steps monitor and strengthen the situation is in place. The charity also made payments to Executive Director during the period as sub-contractor of £12,724. No PAYE employer's registration has been carried out in this reporting period and this is in the process of being set up. There is also an amount of £23,858 owing to the Executive Director for subcontractor costs covering the period April 2023 to March 2024 and does not form part of the receipts and payments accounts.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024

### 1. TRUSTEE REMUNERATION AND EXPENSES

No trustee received any remuneration from the charity in respect of their services during the period.

### 2. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

As this is the first period since the inception of the charity costs incurred for general expenses were paid personally by the Executive Director and these were then reimbursed. At the period end an amount of £2,729 remains outstanding for these costs and does not form part of the receipts and payments account.

The charity also made payments as sub-contractor costs of £12,724 during the period to the Executive Director. An amount covering the period April 2023 to March 2024 remains outstanding and amounts to £21,129. This amount does not form part of the receipts and payments account. There is an agreement with the board of the trustees for this to be paid upon satisfactory funds being available. There is a mutual agreement between the Executive Director and the board of the trustees, as recorded in the minutes of Board Meeting 5 March 2024 that 'upon satisfactory funds being available, at the discretion of the trustees, that the amount shall be reimbursed at increments until it has been completely repaid'.

### 3. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared on a Receipts and Payments basis. Any costs incurred prior to the formal registration of the charity on the 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 forms part of the receipts and payment accounts. The receipts and payments cover a period from September 2022 since the activity started.
