The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 6 July 2023 to 31 March 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

Our Aim/Mission Statement

To raise charitable funds to help disadvantaged, disabled or underprivileged individuals to participate in sport.

Benefits derived from the Charity (including to the public)

Our aims fully reflect the purposes that the charity (Foundation) was set up to further and has been developed with due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The charity, benefits the public by providing financial support to those individuals who meet the above criteria and who are experiencing difficulties in accessing/participating in sport. Such difficulties can include financial hardship that is preventing that individual to participate in or access sport - e.g. an individual who cannot afford to pay an annual subscription fee to join a sporting club or an individual who is unable to participate in sport because they require specialist equipment / kit to do so which they cannot afford to purchase.

Participating in sport can offer a range of benefits including:

- Improved health and physical fitness
- Improved mental wellbeing
- Discipline and commitment
- Opportunities for team work and collaboration
- Improved confidence and social skills
- Reduced isolation

The first applicant that the foundation supported resulted in many of the benefits set out above. The application was received requesting financial support for an 8 year old boy . Like many children of that age, he wanted nothing more than to play sport with his friends. Unfortunately, in order to do so, he required specialist eyewear which his family could not afford to purchase and his coach therefore applied to the Foundation for support. Having reviewed the associated application, the Foundation was satisfied that the application met the required criteria and provided financial support to purchase the eyewear required. The feedback received from his mother captured exactly what the Foundation has been set up to achieve. She explained that prior to receiving this equipment, Finley had become increasingly distant from his friends and somewhat isolated as he was unable to join them in playing sport, which he found extremely frustrating. She confirmed that he was now enjoying playing a range of sports with his friends and was much happier as a result of being able to do so.

Application Process

Applications for financial support are made by completing an application form via the Foundation's website <https://philbennettfoundation.com/>

All applications must meet the Foundations Mission Statement and must be submitted by a teacher, coach or an official member/representative of an organisation. The charity does not accept applications direct from parents or individuals themselves. Two references are required for every application.

Each application is scrutinised objectively by an independent panel from within the Foundation's committee to ensure it meets the criteria set out in our aim. If it does, the applications is further scrutinised to determine how much funding should be provided. In some instances, this will not be the full amount applied for and each application (provide they meet the criteria) will be assessed on the individual circumstances attached to it. Where applications do not meet the criteria, the submitter is notified that the application has not been successful.

There are no geographical boundaries as to who can make an application to the Foundation.

Generation of monies

In order to generate funding to financially support those parties listed within our aim/mission statement, the Charity has held several events to date

Distribution of funding

As at the date of these accounts no applications had been received, subsequently applications have now been flowing in.

During the subsequent period, and in order to maximise the opportunity to encourage and enable individuals to participate in sport, the Charity has (through the Director of Education for Carmarthenshire) made £500 available to every primary school in the Carmarthenshire County. That money must be used for entirely for purchasing sporting equipment to be used in the school. There are a total of 96 schools in the Carmarthenshire County, many of which are located within deprived areas. To date 81 schools have applied and are in the process of receiving their £500 funding. If all 96 schools receive their £500 funding allocation, as is anticipated, the Foundation will have provided £48,000 to purchase sporting equipment that can be used and enjoyed by approximately 26,500 school children.

It is the intention of the Foundation to offer a £500 funding allocation to purchase sporting equipment to every primary school within a different county next year.

The Phil Bennett Foundation has also provided funding to the Scarlets Community Foundation to employ a Scarlets Regional Inclusion Lead Officer and a Scarlets Rugby Officer (Pembrokeshire). These roles will undertake an extensive range of activities to support access to rugby for mixed ability children (male and female), as well as individuals from a range of demographics, fostering engagement and inclusion. 



1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Capital Grants

Grants received which are used to purchase capital items are treated as restricted funds in the balance sheet and released to the income and expenditure account over the life of the asset to which they relate.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments held within a deposit or similar account.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Creditors

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

Going Concern

The trustees have assessed the company's financial position as at the reporting date, and forecasted earnings for the foreseeable future. Taking into consideration the net surplus position at the year end and future earnings, the trustees believe that the charity has sufficient resources to meet its obligations for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, the trustees have prepared these accounts on a going concern basis.
