The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2024.

Objectives and Activities

Aims and Objectives

To advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public throughout England & Wales by providing facilities for Christian worship and fellowship, prayer, religious education, Christian beliefs and practices, outreach and pastoral care for the local community.

The charity has adopted the following strategies for achieving the above objectives:

- Provision of Weekly Church Services to minister to the physical, spiritual and material needs of the congregants.
- Provision of services to individuals, families and community at large. The service includes a wide range of spiritual and social care.
- Provision of spiritual, physical and emotional support, offering home/hospital visits to the sick as well as cleaning and clearing services to those in need (sick/elderly).
- Supporting other charities.
- Offering our services to anyone in need of spiritual help through free Christian counselling, prayers and deliverance solely on the basis of our ability to provide appropriate help and regardless of race, colour, nationality, religion, gender, age, legal status and personal history.

Achievements and Performance

Main Achievements

The charity's programmes/activities were properly managed, executed and reviewed for its impact on members. We carried out a series of visits to the elderly as well as clearing out the infested home of a member and offered hot meals for those in need and unable to provide for themselves. We provided transport and assisted with shopping duties for those who could not, and ministered to the physical, mental and spiritual needs of our members both existing and new. Members experiences/testimonials were encouraging enough as membership continues to steadily increase.

Financial Review

Financial Position

The charity was able to raise a total income of £57,243. Due to expenditure of £61,737 this resulted in a deficit of £4,494 for the year.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds which are the free reserves of the charity at a level which equates to at least 1 month of unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management and administration costs and to respond to emergencies which may arise from time to time. The trustees have set this as a target and are satisfied that the church is in a position to meet its financial obligations, fund its activities and continue to grow.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Charitable company is constituted as a private company limited by guarantee and also governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustee Selection Methods

Generally, trustees are appointed by Board of Trustees. Trustees are appointed by invitation as at when required and depending on their expertise and requirements of the charity.

There are no new trustees appointed during the year. All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits from the charity. Due to the nature of Charity work, trustees appointed have been selected on the basis of their faith, strength of character, skills set in the area of business management and growth and commitment to the vision of the charity.

1. General Information

New Glory Ministry is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated in England & Wales, registered number 13656523 and registered charity number 1204040. The registered office is 12 Bridge Close, Romford, RM7 0AU.

2. Accounting Policies

2.1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)", Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006.

The charitable company is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

2.2. Incoming Resources

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

2.3. Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of the fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Plant & Machinery	25%
Fixtures & Fittings	25%

2.4. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are basic financial assets and include cash in hand and deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and are readily convertible to a known amount of cash with insignificant risk of change in value, and bank overdrafts.
