We expanded last year's "Do What It Takes" campaign — originally focused on education around the signs and symptoms of poor mental health — into a long-term suicide prevention programme, which has been highly successful in reaching a wider awareness audience. We also created additional video resources to provide support and information on social media, encouraging people to join our support community. In addition, we hosted a public awareness event at a local cinema, which was attended by more than 120 members of the public.

Para 1.20	<p>Attracted 24 applications for MHFA training — double last year's interest — and successfully trained 7 new Mental Health First Aiders, significantly strengthening our community support capacity.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The London2Paris challenge amplified our reach to 150,000 people (five times our usual audience) and generated £11,500 in vital fundraising, dramatically increasing visibility and engagement. - Delivered an online challenge that mobilised 25 participants to actively fundraise or champion mental health awareness, expanding our grassroots advocacy. - Produced a powerful mental health awareness video campaign sharing an individual's lived experience. The cinema screening drew 120 attendees, raised £7,500, and the campaign's wider release reached 300,000 viewers — our largest audience to date. - Our growing public presence prompted multiple individuals to seek help through our social media channels.
