Funding

The funding of South Leeds Welcome Centre is generated through the café; room hire and fundraising events.

Achievements and performance 2025

South Leeds Welcome Centre have enjoyed a brilliant year as a charity. Throughout 2025, we have provided more than 17,000 meals to our local community, either onsite in our café or at festivals. We were delighted to participate once again in the Hunslet Rugby Foundation Festival, delivering our food service to attendees and engaging with the local community.

Over the year, we have also welcomed Slimming World into our centre for several months, providing a supportive space for members to meet and work towards their goals. Thousands of young children and adults have passed through our doors during 2025, as we continue to work closely with our partners at Hunslet Rugby Foundation and Belle Isle Senior Action, providing a regular meal service to both organisations.

Our facilities have hosted children's parties, social services meetings, schools' meetings, and baby showers. In addition, we run Youth Clubs and senior breakfast mornings every week with Hunslet Rugby Foundation on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays respectively. We also hosted Kicking For Grassroots, a local organisation in running their Easter, Summer and Christmas activities across 28 days.

We are proud of the achievements and impact of 2025 and look forward to building on these successes into 2026.

We worked at the Belle Isle Gala in July 2024 at the newly formed Coopers playing fields formerly known as Hunslet Parkside playing fields. We were also present at the Hunslet Rugby Foundation annual gala hosted in August 2024 in which we ran a food service for the attendees there. We have welcomed thousands of young children and adults through our doors at our Welcome Centre during 2024, working with our partners at the Hunslet Rugby Foundation and Belle Isle Senior Action of who we provide a meal service to both organisations on a weekly basis. We have hosted children's parties, social services meetings, schools' meetings and baby showers in our facilities, alongside running youth clubs and senior breakfast mornings every week with our partners Hunslet Rugby Foundation, Wednesday, Thursday and Fridays respectively.

We are proud of our achievements and performances of 2024 and look to take many positives into 2025.

As the Charity Trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

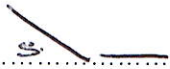
