STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity was established under a constitution (foundation model) dated 10th August 2023 was registered on Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) on 17th August 2023.

Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

The appointment of trustees is in accordance with the Constitution.

The Constitution states that there must be at least 3 trustees (1 appointed trustee and 2 nominated trustees) and the maximum number of 9 (4 appointed trustee and 5 nominated trustees).

Apart from the first charity trustees all trustees are appointed for a three year term by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

Trustee Induction and Training

New trustees are provided with the Charity Commissions 'Roles and Responsibilities of Trustees', the Constitution, the latest statutory financial statements, Annual Report and copies of the minutes. Any additional training required by the new trustees will be identified during induction and may be requested at any point by new and existing trustees, where it is considered useful to their role as trustee.

Organisational Structure

The board of trustees manages the Charity and aims to consider only strategic decisions at its meetings. Trustees are aware that any conflict of interest is declared and recorded, and the person will be withheld from part of the meeting and will not be able to vote on that item. The Board holds an Annual Open Meeting every year, other than that any Charity Trustee can request a meeting during the year.

Risk Management

The major risks to which the Charity is exposed, as identified by the Trustees, have been reviewed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. All systems and procedures are reviewed regularly to ensure they meet charity law and our own organisations aims and objectives.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects

The object of the CIO is:

"The provision and maintenance of a community centre for the use of the inhabitants of Hessele and the neighbourhood without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions and in particular, though not exclusively, for use of a food bank and for other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants".

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty, contained in Section 4 of the Charities Act 2011, to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission. The charitable purpose of the charity within the meaning of the act is contained within its objects stated above.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Review of the financial period

The charity only started to operate late 2024 and has spent its time to date in getting set up and planning future actions.

Financial results

Total Income was £5,000 Total expenditure was £1,844. The surplus for the period was £3,156

The charity doesn't have a reserve policy, as the charity is in its infancy period.

FUTURE PLANS

Statement of Trustee's responsibilities

The Charity has elected to prepare its accounts on the Receipts and Payments basis in line with the Charities Act 2011 which allows non-company charities with an income of less than £250,000 to prepare their accounts on this basis.


Independent Examiners Statement:
