Objectives and activities

The objectives of the CIO are to promote early education for the public benefit in particular, but not exclusively by the provision of free, high quality books for children aged under five, living in Nottingham.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

The main activities undertaken for Public Benefit are the provision of age appropriate books to children registered with the scheme to enhance their reading skills and provide them with a better start for school entry.

Public benefit statement

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'.

Nottingham Imagination Library

Summary of the main achievements during the period

The book gifting scheme, in the City of Nottingham, operated in conjunction with the Dollywood Foundation UK, had been carried out, from inception in March 2012, through the Rotary Club of Nottingham Trust Fund. With the establishment of Nottingham Imagination Library (NIL), the Nottingham scheme has been transferred to NIL and is fully effective from July 2024 to carry on the distribution of books to children already registered on the scheme. With the conclusion of the Small Steps Big Changes Scheme in August 2025, NIL will continue to distribute books to children registered on that scheme, subject to the availability of funds.

At 30 June 2025 there were 3,419 children registered in the City of Nottingham. Since the scheme started in Nottingham in 2012, 563,879 books have been delivered and over 13,000 children have graduated or are currently registered.

Looking Ahead

With the funds held and as more become available it is planned to extend the distribution of books to other parts of the City and September 2025 marked the opening of a scheme in Bestwood.

Risks

The principal risks are the failure of grant applications, donations or fundraising activities which would seriously curtail the ability of NIL to establish new schemes to provide books for children.

Financial review


The Trustee are pleased with the financial position at the year end.

The charity's policy on reserves

The policy of the trustees has been to ensure that sufficient funds are designated as available to meet the cost of providing books for children in a particular area through to age 5 before a scheme is established and to meet administrative costs for a six-month period.



The trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'

Summary of main achievements during the period

The book gifting scheme, in the City of Nottingham, operated in conjunction with the Dollywood Foundation UK, had been carried out, from inception in March 2012, through the Rotary Club of Nottingham Trust Fund. With the establishment of Nottingham Imagination Library (NIL), the Nottingham scheme has been transferred to NIL and is fully effective from July 2024. In April 2024 a Big Reading Challenge was held and raised over £3,000.

At that date there were 533 children registered in 5 schemes for which NIL will, from the accumulated funds transferred from the Rotary Club, pay for the books for these children

through to age 5. There are a further 3,842 children registered under the Small Steps Big Changes scheme funded by the National Lottery for a 10 year period until August 2025

Looking Ahead

With the funds held and as more become available it is planned to fund so far as possible the children in the Small Steps Big Changes scheme to the age of 5 when the National Lottery monies cease at the expiry of the 10 year period and to fund books for children in other wards of the City.

Policy on Reserves

The policy of the trustees has been to ensure that sufficient funds are available to meet the cost of providing books for children in a particular area before a scheme is established and to meet administrative costs for a six month period.

The charity's risks

The principal risks are the failure of grant applications, donations or fund raising activities which would seriously curtail the ability of NIL to establish new schemes to provide books for children.
