In particular, to provide and maintain rescue homes or other facilities for reception, care, and treatment of such dogs prior to adoption homes being found.

Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>Our charity has provided support to dogs taken into our care from homes where people have passed away or unforeseen circumstances put an animal at risk as well as working with local stray kennels in order to help many dogs at risk. We have rehomed over 70 dogs.</p> <p>Due to the over breeding of dogs and other contributing factors such as the cost-of-living crisis and the long-term effects of the covid lockdown, we have seen an increase in neglect and abuse towards animals.</p> <p>We have supported a large number of dogs in need of rehabilitation along with many more dogs in need of veterinary support. This has resulted in high kennel bills and veterinary costs.</p> <p>We provided any essential veterinary care and an individual assessment of each dog. We pride ourselves in matching each rescue dog with a suitable adopter and home depending on the dogs individual needs. Our support, aftercare, and veterinary assistance for ongoing health conditions once each dog is rehomed is also part of our procedure.</p> <p>All potential adopters are home checked, and all the dogs are neutered, fully health checked and vaccinated. Microchipping, defleaing and worming is also an essential part of our adoption procedure.</p> <p>We have been able to carry out our main objectives of rescuing dogs in need in 2023/2024.</p>

Para 1.20	<p>We have rehomed over 70 dogs in this financial year, providing them with essential veterinary care, including neutering, microchipping, and vaccinations, as well as regular fleaing and worming.</p> <p>We have also supported many local families with food and veterinary care to enable them to keep their beloved pets as part of the family unit, rather than the animals end up in rescue. Sadly, due to the rise in the cost of living we expect this trend to continue.</p> <p>We have expanded our fundraising by opening our own charity shop, this has provided extra valuable income to cover increasing costs, we have also started using online auctions platforms for some of the items we have had donated to raise extra funds.</p> <p>We have started building a new kennel block, and a large secure dog field, this will enable us to help more animals in need as well as having a large space to use for 1 to 1 training for the increasing number of dogs that are exhibiting behavioural issues due to the lack of socialisation during the Covid pandemic.</p>


