Para 1.20	<p>The charity was able to raise a reasonable income from fundraising to allow for donations and grants to be made to local community groups and charities totalling £996, this is under-reflective of the donations applicable to the period as multiple payments were made after the year end due to the cycling event taking place mid-summer, just before the financial period end date.</p> <p>Outside the scope of any financial impact, the charity has also undertaken a role in assisting the community which cannot so easily be measured. In the year the charity carried out various food bank collections, these resulted in thousands of donated items with the dates of the collections being in key times of year, e.g. Christmas. The Trustees deem this to be a large and successful part of the annual operations of the charity.</p> <p>As well as the food bank collections, the charity also continued a project in the local area managing a previously unused piece of land and turned it in a community peace garden (using only native plant species) for people to use as a quiet space to retreat to assist with mental health in the community as well as remove an eye sore in the area.</p>

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	The charity was deemed to be in a good financial position at the end of the financial period with £1,114 held as unrestricted funds and £3,114 restricted. The unrestricted funds were held as a buffer for emergency donations required in the new financial period and the restricted funds were held due to a timing difference where the donations were to be made post the period end, a reasonable figure was then held back to allow for continued operations in the following year.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	There are no specific policies held by the trust in respect of holding reserves, but it is deemed by members that the trust should hold onto a reasonable amount of reserves so that any unforeseen local emergencies can be assisted financially. This is at the discretion of the trustees.
Amount of reserves held	Para 1.22	Reserves held at the end of the year to 30/06/2025 were £1,114 (unrestricted), this is a £7 increase upon the previous year. Restricted funds totalled £3,114 (YE 2023 = £408).
Reasons for holding zero reserves	Para 1.22	No reserves are at NIL, it is the general idea of the trust that there are always some funds held in case of any local emergencies as well as a buffer amount to allow for the upfront costs of future fundraising activities.
Details of fund materially in deficit	Para 1.24	No funds are in deficit.
Explanation of any uncertainties about the charity continuing as a going concern	Para 1.23	There are no going concern issues foreseeable, this is helped by the charity having limited fixed costs. The operations have continued into the 2026 calendar year operating with no financial issues.





