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The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 November 2025.

## **Objectives and Activities**

### **Aims and Objectives**

Objectives of the charity are set out below

- The relief of poverty and sickness.
- The provision of education and training.
- Provide food and ration kits with essential items.
- Prevention and cure of curable blindness and education to incurable blindness in India and UK.
- To support the projects designed to enable women and young individuals to generate a sustainable income and be self sufficient.
- To support the charitable projects of other registered charity which carries out the activities as per foundation's objectives.

## **Achievements and Performance**

### **Main Achievements**

During the year 2024-25, the Trust raised £85,366, Gift Aid of £12,868 and interest of £396 towards various charitable projects. Out of this, a total of £69,465 was sent to India to support relief, education, medical, and community welfare programmes.

The Trust supported 8 charitable organisations in India and the UK, implementing projects focused on education, healthcare, women's empowerment, and rural development.

Key Activities:

1. Free Eye Camps and cataract surgeries for curable blindness
2. Educational support for sighted and blind school children
3. Tailoring and sewing training for women in rural areas
4. Free computer classes and coaching for students
5. Value Education and Sanskar Shibir programmes for children
6. Monthly ration kit distribution to needy families
7. Free medical and eye check-up camps in rural regions
8. Mobile Medical Unit service every Sunday in nearby villages

Achievement and performance :

1. 22 Eye Camps held at various locations - 4,496 patients examined and 681 successful eye operations, benefiting a total of 5,177 individuals.
2. Mobile Medical Unit provided free treatment and medicines to 3,000-3,500 patients throughout the year.
3. 100 women trained in tailoring and stitching - many now earning Rs.2000 to 5000 per month through home-based work provided sewing machines to is trained poor women.
4. 90 students received free computer training at Vadodara Centre
5. 100+ children benefited from Value Education classes and 234 children attended Sanskar Shibir camps
6. 1,200-1,500 students underwent free eye check-ups; spectacles provided where needed
7. 10-12 Free Mobile Medical Clinic organised in villages benefiting 2,000-2,500 patients
8. 140 families supported with monthly ration kits for 12 months - benefiting over 500 individuals

**ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

**Charitable activities**

During 2024 the trust raised £59,637 for various projects of the charity. £30,207 was sent to various projects in India as relief and charity work.

The charity supported education of sighted and blind school children, Red Cross Society, Save the Children, tailoring and sewing classes, computer classes for girls and women in rural village of India. Free Eye Camps and cataract surgeries etc.

The Charity supported 6 charitable organisations in India and UK. In association with implementing agencies, The charity carried out eye screening camps for cataract surgeries for curable blindness. It also carried out various other activities such as education of incurable blind school children, training classes of tailoring and sewing, computer classes for girls and women in rural villages of India.

During the year 2024 more than 3,625 cataract operations were performed free of charge and about 26,100 patients in OPD were examined and treated with charity's help at various eye hospital in India.

More than 85 women and girls were trained in tailoring and sewing classes and 50 Sewing machines were given to trained women after their successful completion of sewing training. The charity foundation also, provided free coaching classes to students in rural areas.

Now the trained women and girls are earning Rs.5,000/- (£47) to Rs.10,000/- (£94) or more which helps their families.

25 Blind school children were supported by foundation from their education. The foundation also, provided free coaching classes, books, desks and uniforms to students in rural areas.

The charity also, provided free ration kits every month for a year to more than 60 families.



**1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

**Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

**Resources expended**

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

**Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

**Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
