To gather together sufficient funds for the design, erection and dedication of a suitable Regimental Memorial to celebrate the 300 years of the Regiment's existence. The memorial will be erected at the National Memorial Arboretum

The whole principle of having a Regimental Memorial to celebrate its 300 years of existence was to have it located in a place that was regularly visited, not just by ex members of the Regiment, but also by the general public so that they could remember what has been achieved over the years of its existence. The National Memorial Arboretum (NMA) is open to the public benefit daily at no charge and no restrictions on access.

The Memorial will supplement the activities of the Soldiers of Gloucestershire Museum and thus provide access to the history of the Regiment and its artefacts. The Museum, like the NMA is a source of information, both for veterans and younger people seeking connections with the Regiment. of a historical and heritage nature.
