REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD 1 NOVEMBER 2023 TO 31 DECEMBER 2024

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 1 November 2023 to 31 December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Christ Victory Centre aims to advance the Christian faith and education of Christian principles in England and Wales through:

- Religious meetings, Bible study, events, and education.
- Community outreach and pastoral care.
- Distribution of food and clothing to the vulnerable and disadvantaged.

Main activities

The main activities of Christ Victory Centre during the annual report period include the following:

- Church services are held on Friday and Sunday
- Zoom session held daily in the evenings for those who require prayer
- Kids ministry session held each Tuesday for children ranging from 7 to 23 years old
- Baptising those who wish to dedicate their lives to Jesus
- Providing food for local foodbank
- Handing out food vouchers to anyone in need
- Providing clothing for the local homeless shelter
- Delivering gift boxes to be given to schools (children who the teachers feel are in need of them), elderly (through Age UK) and local people that are in need of them
- Provide small financial support for anyone who needs it (e.g. If someone does not have a bus fare to get to church etc)

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives, and in planning future activities.

Volunteers

The church members make various contributions by volunteering for some operation tasks.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Main Achievements

Through our donations we have been able to touch many peoples lives through our outreach activities which include distributing over 200 Kg of food to our local foodbank which is enough to feed 482 people. We have given out 20 winter packs (each containing thermal sleeping bag, hat, socks, gloves and under garments) during the cold months of the winter to our local homeless shelter which went very well. We delivered 40 gift boxes which were given to school children, struggling families and the elderly (through Age UK).

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Christ Victory Centre charity's total funds raised in the period ended 31 December 2024 amounted to £92,892 of which £30,893 were donations transferred over from the Christ Victory Centre CIC.

At the financial period end, the unrestricted reserves stand at £56,821.

Reserves policy

In accordance with guidelines issued by the Charity Commissioners, the Trustees have adopted a policy regarding reserves which should ensure that there are adequate funds to enable the charity to meet all current and known future liabilities.

The level of reserves is considered and reviewed at regular intervals by the Trustees.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes a charitable incorporated organisation.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The initial selection method was based on volunteers who had (and demonstrated) a passion for furthering the Christian faith and a willingness to play an active role in the operational running of the church.

Organisation

The names of the Trustees who served during the year are set out below.

Trustees meetings are held regularly, with ad hoc meetings being held as and when necessary.

Risk Management

The Trustees carry out an annual review of the risks which the charity may face, have established systems and procedures to mitigate any risks identified and minimise any potential impact should any identified risks materialise.



1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
