Objects: THE OBJECTS OF THE CIO ARE, FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT: (A) TO ADVANCE THE EDUCATION OF PUPILS AT SCHOOL IN KOINADUGU AND FALABA DISTRICTS BY PROVIDING AND ASSISTING IN THE PROVISION OF FACILITIES NOT REQUIRED TO BE PROVIDED BY THE LOCAL EDUCATION AUTHORITY FOR EDUCATION AT SCHOOLS. (B) THE RELIEF OF THOSE IN NEED BY REASON OF YOUTH, AGE, ILL-HEALTH, DISABILITY, OR FINANCIAL HARDSHIP, EITHER GENERALLY OR INDIVIDUALLY, THROUGH THE PROVISION OF GRANTS, GOODS, OR SERVICES. IN FURTHERANCE OF THESE OBJECTIVES BUT NOT OTHERWISE, THE TRUSTEES SHALL HAVE POWER TO ESTABLISH OR SECURE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF: (I) A LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE TO TRAIN TEACHERS, INCENTIVISE THEM TO TEACH IN REMOTE VILLAGES, AND PROVIDE FOOD AND LEARNING MATERIALS TO CHILDREN FROM POOR AND DEPRIVED BACKGROUNDS.
