The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2025.

Legal Structure: Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)

Objectives and Activities:

The objects of the CIO are to prevent or relieve poverty in the UK and in Mukono and Butebo in Eastern Uganda by providing or assisting in the provision of education, training, healthcare projects, and all the necessary support designed to enable individuals to generate a sustainable income and be self-sufficient.

The trustees confirm that the charity's activities are carried out solely for charitable purposes and for the public benefit.

Trustees' Responsibilities:

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records, safeguarding the assets of the charity, and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Public Benefit:

The trustees have complied with their duty under the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

The charity provides facilities and activities for poverty relief, education, training, healthcare, and income generation support for the benefit of disadvantaged individuals and families in the UK and Eastern Uganda.

Achievements and Performance:

During the year, SHAWIN continued to support and promote poverty relief and community development activities in line with its objectives.

Activities undertaken included:

- Providing education and vocational training to individuals and families experiencing poverty;
- Supporting healthcare projects and health awareness initiatives in Mukono and Butebo, Eastern Uganda;
- Offering training, mentoring, and seed funding to enable individuals to generate sustainable income and become self-sufficient;
- Providing direct poverty relief including food, essential supplies, and emergency assistance to those in immediate need; and
- Supporting community development and self-sufficiency initiatives.

The trustees believe that these activities have positively contributed towards reducing poverty, improving health and education outcomes, and increasing self-sufficiency among beneficiaries.

Financial Review:

The trustees are satisfied with the financial position of the charity during the year. Funds received through donations, grants, and charitable contributions were applied towards achieving the charity's objectives and supporting its ongoing activities.

The trustees continue to monitor the financial position of the charity to ensure sufficient resources are available to meet its charitable commitments and operational needs.

Future Plans:

SHAWIN intends to continue developing its poverty relief and community development activities for the benefit of disadvantaged individuals and families in the UK and Eastern Uganda.

Future plans include:

- Expanding education and vocational training programmes in Mukono and Butebo;

- Increasing access to healthcare projects and health awareness initiatives;
- Developing income generation support initiatives to enable self-sufficiency;
- Strengthening monitoring and evaluation to measure impact; and
- Seeking additional grant funding to scale activities.

Structure, Governance and Management:

The charity is governed by its Constitution as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO).

The trustees are responsible for the overall governance and management of the charity and meet regularly to oversee the activities, finances, and strategic direction of SHAWIN.

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted by the Charity, which is a public benefit entity, in the preparation of the accounts are as follows.

1.1 Basis of preparation

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of charitable properties and fixed asset investments and investment properties at valuation.

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.


