2. Structure, Governance and Management

Governing document:

Community Martial Arts Venues is governed by a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) Constitution, adopted on 16 November 2023.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees:

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the provisions of the CIO Constitution. Trustees are selected based on their experience and skills relevant to martial arts, community engagement, and charitable governance.

Organisational structure:

As the charity has not yet commenced operational activities, all governance and management responsibilities have been undertaken directly by the trustees. No paid staff or volunteers were engaged during the reporting period.

3. Objectives and Activities

Charitable objects:

To advance the education and physical health of the public through the provision of affordable, accessible martial arts training venues and related community activities, particularly for disadvantaged or underrepresented groups.

Public benefit statement:

The trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when planning the charity's activities. During this reporting period, no charitable activities were undertaken as the charity was in its preparatory phase prior to the commencement of operations.

4. Achievements and Performance

During the reporting period, the charity focused on establishing its governance and legal framework, including registration with the Charity Commission. No operational activities, fundraising, or service delivery took place during this period.

The trustees have continued to explore opportunities for partnerships, funding, and suitable venues to enable future delivery of martial arts programmes and community engagement activities.

5. Financial Review

Financial position:

No income or expenditure was recorded during the reporting period. The charity held no assets or liabilities as of 1 September 2024.

As no funds have yet been received, a reserves policy will be developed once operations and financial activities commence.
