We have worked on the media campaigns, web-site and fundraising, and raising awareness to the needs of the medics and healthcare in Ukraine.</p> <p>We have most certainly attracted the attention of the media, had support from the healthcare industry, but most importantly had immense support from our healthcare colleagues across the UK. Leo already established good contacts in Ukraine through his personal charitable efforts prior to establishing the charity. We are certainly building on that foundation.</p>
