Financial Review

Total income for the year amounted to £19,381 derived predominantly from charitable donations received from the public. Expenditure for the same period totalled £13,700 resulting in a net surplus of £5,681 at the year end. The charity is administered by 3 trustees, who have ensured that all funds were applied in accordance with the charity's objectives and for the benefit of its intended beneficiaries.


