Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	The charity received a total donation amount of £9980 for the reporting period. Of this the charity made grants and provided services such as food subsistence parcel towards our charitable purpose totalling £6055. The trustees are all volunteers and received no payment nor claim any expenses. All donations received have gone towards charitable activities apart from Bank fees of £45 for money transfer to Bangladesh. The charity currently holds cash in hand at bank and unrestricted funds of £3880, which is above the minimum reserve level set by the trustees.

The board is satisfied with the performance of the charity during this initial foundational year and consider that the charity is well positioned to continue its activities during the coming years.

The charity is incorporated as a CIO and governed by its own constitution and the trustees have overall control and responsibility for policy and major decision making.

Public benefit

The trustees have sought to ensure that the charity is fulfilling its charitable purpose to benefit the public by raising funds towards the objectives of the charity as defined in our constitution. In doing so we have considered both the Charities Act 2011 and Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

Fundraising activities

KADVIAs main source of charity fundraising activities during the year has been through social media related appeals and donations of zakat (Islamic tax on wealth that individuals must pay once per year) monies from contributors.
