 - Youth meetings on zoom is held on the second Sunday of every month – where we provide a biblical perspective on how to deal with practical challenges in life.
 - Apart from regular services, the organization performs vigil prayer meetings, youth meetings, Bible teachings, family seminars, and children's activities separately.
 - The organization operates festive services for the community as follows;
 - Christmas Celebrations inviting other Churches to perform programmes
 - Good Friday Service
 - Annual Family Camp at ROCK UK Centre for 4 days
 - Thanksgiving Service for children who had completed their A levels successfully and moved to University



