Our main achievements since becoming a charity in February 2024, we have rehomed 9 dogs to new families. We have also helped with 9 families that required guidance, support and advice to enable them to keep their dogs in their current home and avoid rehoming their dog. At the end of the period of this report, we had 2 dogs in kennels, Tino and Ella and 2 dogs awaiting rehoming, Ted and Arlo.

We have raised in the region of £19,000 in this period. This has been raised by the hard work and dedication of the charity's supporters including Trustees and committee members.

Our income is diverse and comes from multiple sources.
