FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2025

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)".

Objectives and activities

The relief of those in need, by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.

The core principles are:

Enhanced Experiences: Striving to improve the lives of those in the care system and for care leavers by providing them with tools for greater confidence, self-worth, life skills and employment.

Models of Excellence: Creating replicable models of success that can be adopted by others, which will support rapid and sustainable change.

Mentorship and Collaboration: Collaborating with others within their area of focus. Acting as mentors to other organisations, facilitating quick and effective progress across the 4 nations.

Trailblazers in Action: Uniting individuals and organisations with a proven track record of proactive, collaborative, and innovative practices.

Engaging with decision makers at both local and national levels: Using their combined experience, expertise and professional standing to support the improvement of the care system and beyond in relation to their area of focus

Achievements and performance

Significant activities and achievements against objectives

The charity was established in February 2024. During the first period, most of the charities focus was on raising funds and preparing for the first 'One Voice Summit' which was held in April 2025.

The first quarter of 2025 was focused entirely on putting on 'The One Voice Summit.' A 2-day event where over 110 experts were involved in delivering keynotes, panels and breakout sessions. We had 48 exhibitors and 900 participants. The feedback was unilaterally positive and can be found on the charity website, as can the videos of the entire event. We also created a Directory of every contributor - this is also on the website.

Since the Summit our activities have been focused on ensuring that the 'One Voice Summit' was the catalyst for positive and lasting change.

We continue to develop new partnerships and initiatives as we move forward. It is vital that we do not fall into the age-old trap of repackaging old ways of working, which have proved to be ineffective. Sadly, this has often been the case in the care system in the past.

Our Action Hub initiative is gaining traction; we now have several Action Hubs signed up and others in the pipeline. These cover a range of vital aspects of life for those who are care experienced: education, health, employment, housing, financial security and sport.

We have the verbal support of Josh McAliser Minister for Children. We are waiting for an official letter from him with his endorsement.

We have signed up the first two Local Authorities to our 'Wrap Around Local Authorities' initiative and have two more in the pipeline.

We have held three 'The Power Of Resilience' evenings, these were well received. One was held at Brentwood School and 2 at the Shard. These were for different audiences.

Much effort has gone into initiating conversations with a significant number of organisations with a view to engaging them in collaborations with us. Whilst this is time-consuming, it is vital if we are to increase the number of organisations involved and to support and expand the sharing good practice and opportunities for collaboration.

Much time has been spent of fundraising to underpin the cost of the Summit.

Financial review

The charity's total income for the period amounted to £310,341, of which £146,742 was unrestricted and £163,599 was restricted to specific projects. Restricted funds were primarily used towards the 'One Voice Summit.

At the period end, the charity held total reserves of £1,190, all of which were unrestricted.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity remains in a sound financial position and that sufficient resources are available to continue its charitable activities for the foreseeable future.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Plans for future periods

We are working on expanding the number of Fatima's UK Campaign Action Hubs nationally.

With organisations who are:

- Already working with young people who are care experienced
- Working with disadvantaged groups but will now target services to those who are care experienced
- Those who will be starting from scratch and will develop opportunities for those who are care experienced. In the main this will be employers

We are bringing together groups of Action Hubs to create Super Action Hubs based on:

- Geography
- Focus (e.g. education, housing, employment, mental health, sport)
- Where there is a central organisation with multiple partners

We plan to hold our first Super Hub event in Birmingham in July and a second in Essex in the Autumn. The intention of the event is to:

- Celebrate the great work which is already happening
- Share the learning
- Develop further collaboration within the hub and externally
- To raise awareness of potential Action Hubs
- To raise public awareness

A meeting of MPs in Westminster is scheduled for June. David Burton Sampson MP for Southend, is hosting the meeting.

We are working towards the creation of a Care Leavers Charter - based on the structure of The Armed Forces Covenant, it will have three standards: bronze, silver, and Gold. As 190+ local authorities have signed up to the Armed Forces Covenant, they are familiar with the principle of guaranteeing services for those who have left the armed services within each category.

We will be working with local authority representatives to develop the Charter, as having ownership is vital if it is to work effectively. Given the coming reorganisation of the way local government is delivered, we feel that the charter, if adopted, would help ensure that care leavers are not left exposed in the general melee which is inevitable in such significant changes.

Our website will be rebranded and redeveloped during 2026. It will have all the information currently on our website and share information about each of the organisations we are collaborating with and the impact they are having on the lives of those care experienced people they work with.

At the moment all the operational activities of the charity are being undertaken by Fatima and Gina. We recognise that for the charity to grow, we need to create a small team to support our work and to help us expand. This development will be entirely dependent on having the sustainable funds to support it.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee, governed by its constitution dated 16 February 2024. The members have no liability in the event of the Charity being wound up.


Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Independent examiner's statement



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2025

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)". The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities not to prepare a statement of cash flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the Charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the Charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the Charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1 Accounting policies

(Continued)

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the Charity's accounting policies, the Trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

Achievements and performance

Significant activities and achievements against objectives

The charity was established in February 2024. During the first period, most of the charities focus was on raising funds and preparing for the first 'One Voice Summit' which was held in April 2025.

Financial review

The charity's total income for the period amounted to £78,458, of which £13,458 was unrestricted and £65,000 was restricted to specific projects. Restricted funds were primarily used towards the 'One Voice Summit'.

At the period end, the charity held total reserves of £31,184 of which £1,800 were unrestricted and £29,384 were restricted.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity remains in a sound financial position and that sufficient resources are available to continue its charitable activities for the foreseeable future.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the Period.

Plans for future periods

Fatima's UK Campaign inaugural 'One Voice Summit' was held at The Guildhall in London on the 23rd and 24th of April 2025. The summit brought together professionals from every aspect of care and for care leavers, providing the opportunity for meaningful collaboration and the sharing of good practice whilst raising awareness and ensuring that those who were care-experienced had a voice.

The agenda was packed: 120 contributors were involved as speakers, panel members or engaged in delivering in breakout sessions, 48 organisations exhibited. Over the 2 days, there were over 900 delegates. The feedback has been tremendous, but the summit was simply the catalyst for future change. Fatima's UK Campaign is determined to build on the shared enthusiasm, motivation and momentum which was created through the Summit and to initiate and facilitate aligned action moving forward.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee, governed by its constitution dated 16 February 2024. The members have no liability in the event of the Charity being wound up.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)". The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities not to prepare a statement of cash flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the Charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the Charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the Charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1 Accounting policies

(Continued)

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

2 Critical accounting estimates and judgements

In the application of the Charity's accounting policies, the Trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.
