2. Structure, Governance and Management

Hands and Feet UK is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), registered with the Charity Commission on 11th April 2024.

Trustees are recruited and appointed in accordance with the charity's constitution. Day-to-day management is overseen by the trustees, who meet regularly to discuss strategy, progress, and governance.

3. Objectives and Activities

The charity's purpose is:

"To relieve poverty and advance education, health and community development for children, youth and families living in deprived areas in the Philippines."

Our primary activities include:

- Providing aid, food, clothing, and essential supplies to families in San Fernando and surrounding areas in the Philippines.
- Supporting local education efforts by supplying school materials.
- Partnering with local organisations, schools and churches to run community-based initiatives.

- Providing compassionate relief during times of need.

All activities align with our public benefit duty under the Charities Act 2011.

4. Achievements and Performance

In the period covered by this report, Hands and Feet UK has:

- Run 171 outreach feedings to: CGPC, AsuSenna, Supplied food and hygiene parcels to vulnerable households.
- Run 101 Discipleship groups.
- Run 158 Bible study groups.
- Run a community feeding and skills development programme at San Joaquin and Cotmo.
- Partnered with Homeschool Learning Group Community of Bicol and Garchitorena in the Philippines to extend aid to underserved barangays (villages).
- Purchased a minibus as a safer means of transport.
- Visited several orphanages to gain insight on how to set an orphanage up.

These efforts have supported approximately 429 individuals and families during the year.

5. Financial Review

Balance carried over from December 2024 to January 2025: £16,920.39.

Total income for the year January 2025 to December 2025: **£44,155.17**. This is over two bank accounts and includes inter-charity transfers.

Total expenditure for the year January 2025 to December 2025: **£52,998.98**. This is over two bank accounts and includes inter-charity transfers. This includes £67.97 not represented in receipts. As this is 0.1% of total expenditure, it can be waived on this occasion. Therefore, the uplifts in the accounts show a total of £52,931.01.

The total net loss over the financial period 1st January 2025 to 31st December 2025 was **£8,843.81**.

Income was generated primarily through:

- Donations from individual supporters.
- Fundraising events.
- Gift Aid claims via Stewardship (directly managed through Stewardship).

The amount carried forward as a result would be £8,144.55, but due to the £67.97 unaccounted for, the total amount carried forward is £8,076.58.

Reserves policy:

The charity aims to maintain a reserve equivalent to three months' operating costs to ensure sustainability. As of year-end 2025 our reserves stood at £7,000.

No investments are held. After reserves an excess of **£1,076.58** is carried forward year 2026. All funds are applied directly to charitable activities and overheads are kept minimal.

6. Plans for the Future

Our priorities for the coming year include:

- Expanding outreach to additional communities in Camarines Sur.
- Launching new educational support schemes and health workshops.
- Registering local partnerships to improve operational impact in the field.
- Explore the options to purchase land for an orphanage.
- Research to process for establishing a Foundation Trust in the Philippines.

We also aim to strengthen our UK supporter base through regular communication and events.

7. Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and UK Accounting Standards.

They are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records and safeguarding the charity's assets.

Notes for Trustees' Report (Summary)

The balance brought forwards (BBF) at the beginning of 2025 was £16,920.39.

In the financial year January to December 2025, Hands and Feet UK generated a total income of £44,155.17 from donations, which included some restricted funds, as documented.

£4533 of this was restricted funds received in February 2025 and November 2025 for the purposes of transportation and visitor expenses. This was spent as instructed, so no restricted funds are to be carried over to 2026.

The balance carried forwards, plus income gained, totalled £61,075.58.

In the financial year January to December 2025, total expenditure was £52,998.98. This includes £67.97 unaccounted for due to lack of receipt.

As of 31st December 2025, funds with Hands and Feet UK stood at £8,076.58.

As per the reserves policy, £7000 of this fund is held to cover 3 months' worth of expenses.

This leaves a remainder of £1,076.58 as income ready and available to be used for the charity heading into 2026, some of which will be used to fund planned expansions.
