Para 1.20	During the year, the charity successfully advanced its objectives through a range of activities, including a fundraising ball, summer rowing camps, national event welfare support and purchasing rowing equipment. As a result the coaching staff have been able to focus on coaching using updated equipment and the rowers have benefited from having that equipment and they also benefited from the welfare support as they were fed performance supporting nutrition and were provided with an area to interact as a team and recover between races. Feedback and outcomes indicate that the charity's work has made a tangible difference to beneficiaries' circumstances. In addition, the charity's activities have contributed to wider benefits to society, such as promoting school community cohesion, reducing pressure on school resources, supporting long-term wellbeing.

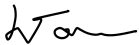

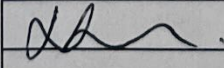
