Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	The purposes of Siraj Foundation UK are to relieve poverty and financial hardship anywhere in the world by providing food, essential items, emergency support, education, training and healthcare initiatives. The charity also aims to promote the preservation of good health through awareness and medical initiatives, advance religious harmony through education and interfaith engagement, and provide facilities for social welfare to improve the conditions of life for individuals in need, particularly those affected by financial hardship, disability, age or social circumstances.
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	During the year, the charity focused on providing financial support to charitable initiatives aligned with its objectives. Key activities included: • A contribution of £750 towards the construction of a mosque led by Rima Uddin • A donation of £464 to Coventry Sonali Lions Club to support the provision of food for homeless individuals • A contribution of £1,670 to Peterborough Muslim Community Initiative (PMCI) towards the establishment of a mosque in Peterborough These activities supported both local and wider community needs, including the provision of immediate relief

		through food distribution and long-term community development through the establishment of places of worship. The charity's activities provided direct public benefit. Homeless individuals benefitted from access to food through organised feeding initiatives, addressing immediate needs. In addition, wider community groups benefitted from contributions towards mosque projects, which serve as centres for worship, community cohesion and support services. The completion of the mosque project in Peterborough (post year-end) represents a significant long-term benefit to the local community by providing a dedicated space for religious, educational and social activities.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	During the year, Siraj Foundation UK made targeted financial contributions in line with its charitable objectives, focusing on both immediate relief and long-term community development. The charity contributed £464 to support homeless feeding initiatives through Coventry Sonali Lions Club. This provided direct assistance to individuals experiencing homelessness, ensuring access to essential food provision and addressing immediate welfare needs. In addition, the charity contributed £750 towards a mosque construction project led by Rima Uddin, and £1,670 to Peterborough Muslim Community Initiative (PMCI) to support the development of a mosque in Peterborough. While the Peterborough mosque was completed after the year end, the funding provided during the year played a role in enabling its completion. These contributions have supported the creation of community infrastructure that facilitates religious practice, education and community cohesion. The mosque developments are expected to deliver ongoing and long-term benefits to their respective communities. Overall, the charity's activities have delivered both immediate impact, through direct support to vulnerable individuals, and sustained benefit through investment in community facilities.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	At the end of the reporting period, the charity held cash funds of £271. During the year, total incoming resources amounted to £3,190, with total expenditure of £2,919. Expenditure primarily consisted of charitable donations made in furtherance of the charity's objectives, including support for mosque construction projects and contributions towards homeless feeding initiatives. The charity operated on a straightforward receipts and payments basis, with funds applied directly to charitable activities.
