Proclamation of the Gospel and Corporate Worship During the 2024-2025 financial year, the Church of God World Fellowship (CGWF) remained steadfast in its mission to proclaim and disseminate the Gospel. We successfully conducted over 200 church services catering to a diverse demographic of both adults and children. In response to modern community needs, the majority of these services were delivered via digital and virtual platforms. This "hybrid" approach allowed us to transcend geographical barriers, reaching individuals in their homes and expanding our spiritual fellowship to those who might otherwise be isolated. These services provided a vital space for spiritual growth, biblical teaching, and communal worship. Pastoral Rites and Life Events The Church also served as a cornerstone for the community during significant life milestones. We presided over a substantial number of sacramental and pastoral offices, including: • Baptisms: Welcoming new believers into the faith. • Weddings: Supporting the sanctity of marriage within our community. • Dedications: Partnering with parents to commit the next generation to God's service. • Funerals: Providing comfort, hope, and dignified memorial services for bereaved families. Mentorship and Community Support Beyond formal services, CGWF acted as a source of practical and spiritual strength. Our leadership provided ongoing advice, mentorship, and pastoral guidance to young people navigating modern challenges. Furthermore, this support was extended to adults within the congregation and the wider community who required emotional or spiritual assistance, ensuring that no individual felt unsupported during times of need.

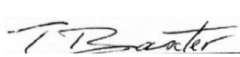

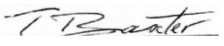
