As I reflect on this past year, I am overwhelmed with gratitude and awe at the mighty hand of God working through Seek Saviour Gospel Outreach (SSGO). Though we faced our share of trials, it is undeniable that His grace has been sufficient, and His strength has been made perfect in our weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9). It is with great joy and humility that I present to you this year's Annual Report—a testament to what God has done through your prayers, giving, and unwavering support.

## **Walking in Love, Serving with Sacrifice**

Our mission at SSGO is simple yet profound: to extend the love of Christ to the vulnerable, the underserved, and the broken, both locally and globally. This year, by God's grace, our footprint expanded across communities in the United Kingdom and beyond. We did not merely distribute goods or teach skills; we planted seeds of hope, dignity, and transformation.

## **UK Achievements: Empowering Communities, Touching Lives**

In the UK, we deepened our outreach efforts in powerful ways. Over 3,000 community members received practical support in the form of shelter, warm clothing, and nutritious meals—essentials that restored dignity and warmth during trying times.

Our vocational training programmes empowered over 180 individuals through tailored workshops in:

- Job application and resume development
- Fashion design and tailoring
- Confectionery and baking
- Professional networking and entrepreneurship

We also served our faith family with both financial assistance and mental health support, especially for struggling households and single-parent families navigating inflation and isolation.

Our team led community integration sessions for over 120 new immigrants, offering guidance on acclimating to life in the UK, understanding the healthcare and education systems, and building supportive networks.

Through strategic collaborations, we partnered with reputable professionals to deliver career advancement training in:

- Project Management
- Information Technology
- Data Analysis using Power BI, Excel, and Tableau

These efforts unlocked new career paths and rekindled hope in dozens of families

*Each initiative was bathed in prayer and anchored in our unwavering belief that “whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me” (Matthew 25:40)*

### **Our Challenges: Faith in the Face of Limitations**

## Brief History

Seek Saviour Gospel Outreach (SSGO) was birthed from a divine burden to extend the Gospel beyond the church walls into hurting communities, physically, spiritually, and emotionally and was registered on the 15th of August 2024 by a group of faith-led professionals and ministers, SSGO began as a small initiative offering street evangelism and care packages to the homeless in Wolverhampton.

Over time, our impact expanded rapidly, encompassing holistic support: from vocational training, immigrant integration, and faith-based counselling in the UK, to clean water, healthcare support, and educational resources in underserved regions of Nigeria.

Today, SSGO is a registered faith-based charity rooted in the teachings of Jesus, with outreach teams, partners, and training programmes spanning across both the UK and West Africa.

## Governance Structure

- ❖ **Board of Directors:** we have 5 board members who Provide strategic oversight, financial accountability, and spiritual guidance. Members bring experience in ministry, humanitarian work, finance, and nonprofit leadership.
- ❖ **Advisory Council:** A body of spiritual leaders, community elders, and technical experts who offer counsel on theological direction, outreach strategy, and ethical standards.

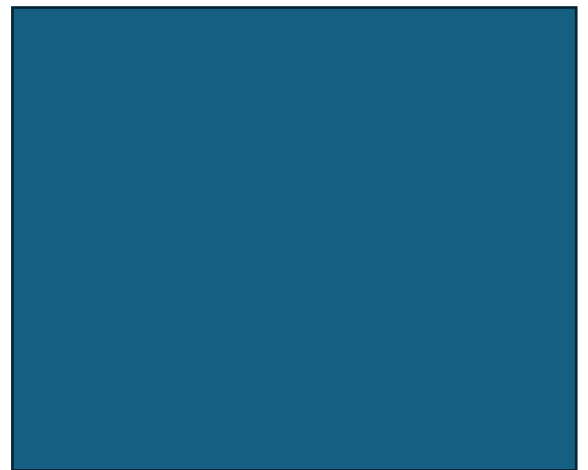

## Program 1: Shelter & Support for the Vulnerable



### Objective & Description:

- ❖ To alleviate hardship and restore dignity by providing essential support—such as food, clothing, and shelter—to the homeless, displaced, and financially struggling individuals across wolverhampton and surrounding regions.

### Activities & Outcomes:

- ❖ Distributed weekly food and hygiene parcels to over 480 individuals
- ❖ Provided winter clothing and blankets to 320 vulnerable persons
- ❖ Referred 90 homeless individuals to transitional housing services
- ❖ Helped 30 individuals secure temporary accommodations

### Partnerships:

- ❖ Local churches and shelters (e.g., Kingdom Rescue Mission)
- ❖ Municipal food banks and the Faith in Action network

## Objective & Description:

- ❖ To equip individuals—especially unemployed youth and women—with practical, income-generating skills to promote economic independence and long-term empowerment.

## Partnerships:

## Activities & Outcomes:

- ❖ Trained **225 people** in:
  - Fashion Design
  - Baking & Confectionery
  - CV Writing & Job Interview Skills

- ❖ **75 trainees** started home-based businesses or secured jobs
- ❖ Held **3 community business exhibitions** showcasing products

- ❖ To provide newly arrived immigrants and church families in distress with the tools, support, and spiritual guidance to integrate successfully into UK society.

### Activities & Outcomes:

- ❖ Assisted **150 new immigrants** with cultural orientation, navigating public services, and community integration

## Program 5: Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)



### Objective & Description:

- ❖ To provide clean water and promote hygiene in underserved rural communities in Eastern Nigeria to reduce disease and restore community dignity.

### Partnerships:

- ❖ Local engineers and drilling teams
- ❖ Rural health authorities
- ❖ Churches in Anambra, Enugu, and Ebonyi

### Activities & Outcomes:

- ❖ Constructed 3 boreholes, impacting over 3,000 villagers
- ❖ Educated 600+ community members on sanitation practices
- ❖ Provided handwashing stations to 5 local schools

### Faith-Based Impact:

Water dedication services included prayer, scripture readings, and evangelism. Two churches were planted after the borehole installations.



## Program 6: Maternal Support, Health & Wellness



### Objective & Description:

- ❖ To improve health outcomes for mothers and children through medical aid, essential supplies, and community-based education.

### Partnerships:

- ❖ Local midwives and women's ministries
- ❖ Faith Health Nigeria Initiative

### Activities & Outcomes:

- ❖ Distributed 88 baby kits (diapers, formula, clothes)
- ❖ Supplied 12 rural clinics with medications
- ❖ Held antenatal classes in 4 communities
- ❖ Provided transport vouchers for pregnant women to reach health centres

### Faith-Based Impact:

- ❖ Gospel messages shared at each clinic visit. Four mothers gave their lives to Christ after SSGO-led devotions.

## **Program 7: Education**

- ❖ Conducted literacy enhancement sessions with 12 teachers
- ❖ Offered faith-based leadership clubs for youth

- ❖ Students learned memory verses, worship songs, and Christian leadership principles during assemblies. Scripture club membership grew by 40%.

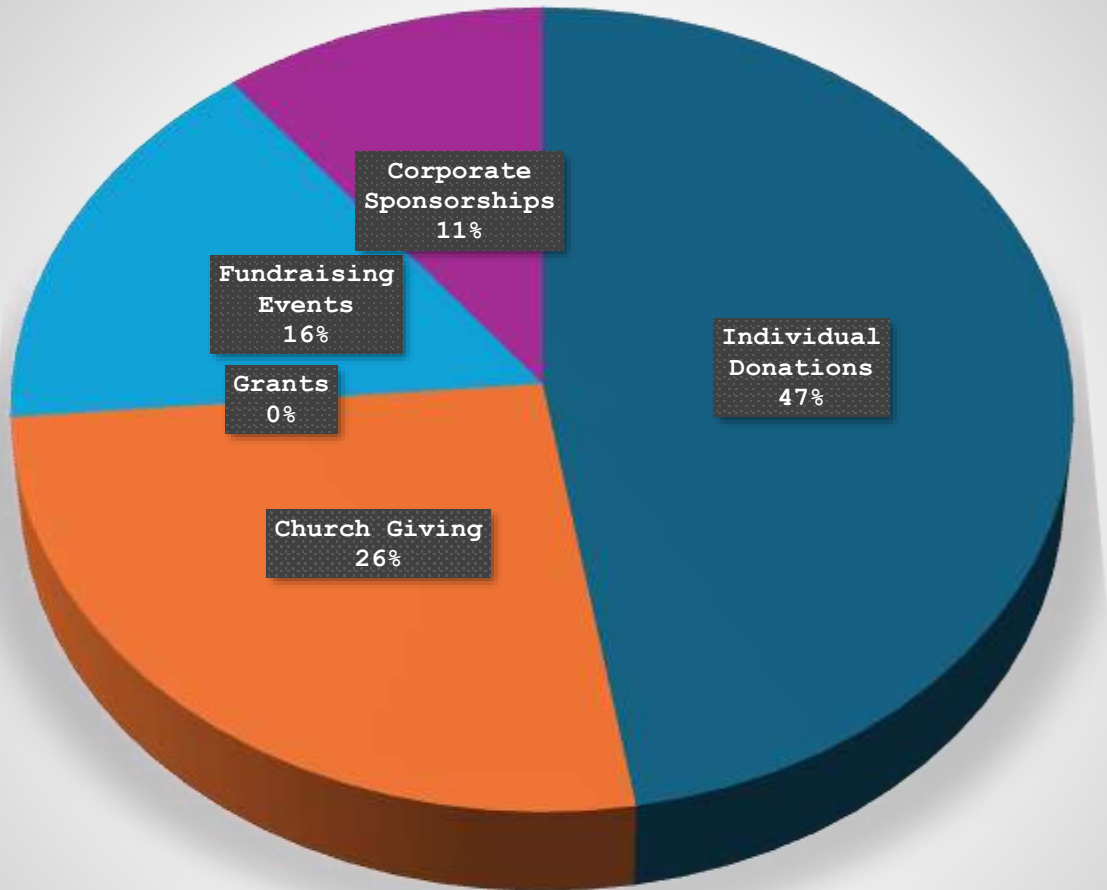

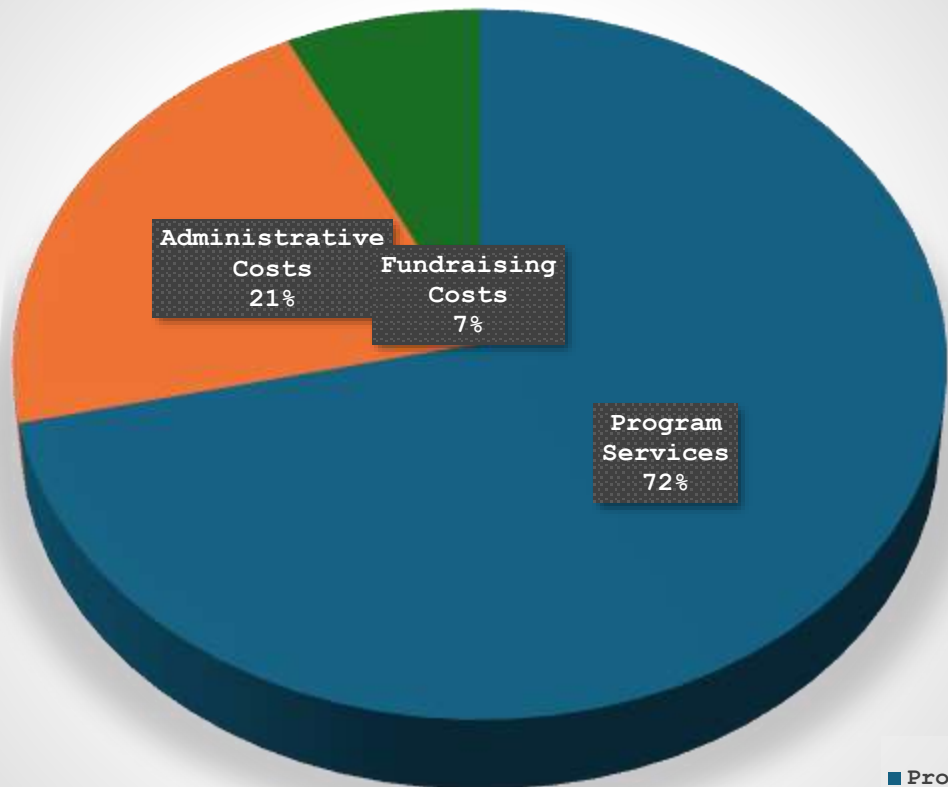
