Activities and Achievements

During our first year, the trustees focused on establishing the charity's operational and governance framework while beginning community-focused activities.

Key Areas of Activity

Education Support

The charity explored opportunities to assist children and young people who face barriers to educational opportunities due to financial hardship.

Community Welfare

Support was provided through charitable outreach aimed at helping individuals experiencing financial difficulties and social isolation.

Elderly and Disability Support

The charity promoted social inclusion by encouraging activities and support services designed to improve wellbeing among elderly and less-able people.

Religious and Cultural Activities

The charity supported activities that promote understanding of Hindu traditions, values, and community engagement for public benefit.

Animal Welfare and Environmental Awareness

The charity continued to promote compassion towards animals and awareness of environmental protection and biodiversity.

Governance and Management

The charity is governed by a Board of Trustees responsible for overseeing the administration and management of the organisation.

The trustees ensure that:

- Funds are used solely for charitable purposes
- Proper financial controls are maintained
- Risks are monitored and managed appropriately
- Safeguarding and compliance policies are implemented
