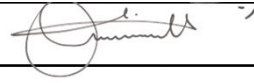

Organisational and Activities Report

1. Background

God's Mercy Ministries was incorporated in September 2024. The church began as a fellowship of believers from different cultural and national backgrounds in Hartlepool. It was established to provide a welcoming place where individuals and families could worship together, build relationships and receive spiritual and practical support. The church currently meets once a week at:

2. Membership and Attendance

The church currently has approximately 50 worshippers, comprising:

Children:40

Youth: 12

Adults: 50

A significant proportion of the congregation consists of newly arrived immigrants and families with limited financial resources. The church seeks to create an inclusive and supportive environment where people from different backgrounds feel welcomed, valued and connected to the local community.

3. Activities and Community Support

The church provides weekly worship services, prayer, Christian fellowship, religious education, pastoral care and outreach activities.

In recognition of the financial and social challenges faced by many members, approximately 40% of the church's income is used to provide welfare and practical support. This includes assistance with essential needs such as food and temporary accommodation or shelter.

This support forms an important part of the church's commitment to expressing the Christian faith through compassion, kindness and practical service.

4. Workers and Volunteers

The majority of the church's work is undertaken by

volunteers. These individuals contribute their time, skills and energy every week to ensure that worship services and other church activities continue to operate effectively.

At present, the church has two principal leaders:

The Pastor

The Assistant Pastor

They are supported by committed volunteers who assist with the children, worship activities, administration, pastoral support, outreach and the general organisation of weekly meetings.

5. Structure, Governance and Management

The church is currently led by the Pastor and Assistant Pastor, who oversee its spiritual leadership and day-to-day activities.

As the church continues to grow, it is committed to developing appropriate governance and management arrangements. These will support accountability, responsible financial management, safeguarding and effective delivery of the church's charitable purposes.

6. Aims and Mission

The principal aims of God's Mercy Ministries are:

To advance the Christian faith for the public benefit in accordance with the church's Basis of Faith.

To provide facilities and opportunities for Christian worship, prayer, religious education, fellowship, outreach and pastoral care.

To undertake other charitable activities which, in the opinion of the charity trustees, put the Christian faith into practice in accordance with the church's Basis of Faith.

To ensure that the advancement of these purposes is consistent with the Doctrinal Distinctives and Ethical Statements adopted and amended by the church from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Church Handbook.

7. Looking Ahead

God's Mercy Ministries remains committed to building a welcoming multicultural Christian community in Hartlepool. The church intends to continue developing its worship, children's activities, outreach and pastoral support while strengthening its governance and relationships within the wider community.

Through the dedication of its leaders and volunteers, the church hopes to support more individuals and families, particularly new immigrants and those experiencing financial or social hardship.
