Report of the Trustees

Period 26 September 2024 to 31 March 2025

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 26 September 2024 to 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives are:- To advance in life and help young people living in the united kingdom through:

- (a) The provision of support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals;
- (b) Advancing education;
- (c) Relieving unemployment;
- (d) The provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare, designed to improve their conditions of life;

and other charitable purposes.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

As the Charity was only established 6 months before its financial year-end, the months up to the year-end were devoted to the compliance with the various statutory and regulatory requirements and the creation of banking facilities. The Charity received its first piece of income on 24th March 2025 and by the year-end its total income had reached just over £900,000.

The trustees are currently considering the applications received to date for future potential grants.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level to provide sufficient funds to cover management and administrative costs. Unrestricted funds were maintained at this level throughout the period under review and the balance at the year-end amounted to £899,526. The charity currently has no restricted funds.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Introduction

The Trust is a registered charity set up to advance in life and help young people living in the United Kingdom and other charitable purposes, the activities of the trust are governed by its Constitution.

Legal status

The Trust is registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Apart from the first charity trustees, every trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees. In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.

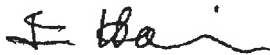

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and with the Charities Act 2011.

The trustees have considered the available cash resources of the charity and its current forecasts and has a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources and support to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, considered to be at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102.

The presentation currency is £ sterling.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these accounts are set out below.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
