Trustees' Report

The trustees present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the period ended 31 December 2025.

Achievements and performance

Our objects are broadly: 1) advancing Christian faith through worship and discipleship; 2) promoting youth work, primarily through sponsorship of the local Boys Brigade and Girls Association (BBGA); and 3) gathering people together through provision of community facilities. In all we do, we seek to improve the conditions of life for all.

This year has seen regular, weekly worship services by the United Reformed Church as well as Hope Community Church. Further opportunities for learning, fellowship and growth have been offered, particularly at Christmas and Easter.

The BBGA as well as the Girl Guiding groups continue to grow, underpinned by our support. Children from across the whole of Gateshead are given the opportunity to discover skills and confidence through these activities. Trustees are personally involved in both, ably assisted by teams drawn from the local community.

This period has seen increased demand for our community space, in addition to our faith and youth use. Unfortunately, the current configuration of the building does not allow for more users at peak times and we have sadly had to turn enquiries away. Our community partners currently include:

- exercise activities: line dancing, yoga, gentle movement for older people, as well as energetic Zumba dance); and
- fellowship and interests: the University of the Third Age (a varied programme for retired people); Generals Outpost (wargames), TrainTime (childrens' play), and birthday parties.

Financial review

The Charity accounts show that the Charity increased general reserves by £20,020. However, taking into account the one-off receipts being; rebates from energy suppliers of £8,056 and a legacy from a deceased member of £5,000, this surplus is reduced to £6,964.

The increase of £6,964 can be attributed to rental income due to greater demand for the community space and prudent financial management.

Taking this into account the Charity continues to run in a viable position with minimal reserves in accordance with the Charity's reserve policy.

Plans for future periods

Aims and key objectives for future periods

We want to do more, but our ageing premises (which have not seen adequate investment over the years) are letting us down. The community hall heating is barely adequate, the layout labyrinthine, and facilities are dated and tired. As a result, we are embarking on an ambitious regeneration programme. This is one reason why restricted reserves are increasing to £8,290 as we fundraise for the considerable sums just needed in preparation. We have taken the first steps, including a Feasibility Study drawn up by architect Dan Kerr, and are excited to see what could be possible.

Our vision for the future is of an enhanced and attractive community space with a well-run café, which at a stroke would be the largest fully accessible space for eating and drinking in Low Fell. The existing facilities would be upgraded and work done to improve configuration, enabling greater community use. Financial and environmental sustainability are core outcomes, ensuring that the objects can continue to be met in the future.

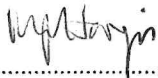

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008, and the provisions of the constitution. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Period from 10 October 2024 to 31 December 2025

1 Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the second edition of the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Basis of preparation

Denewell Avenue United Reformed Church meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Income and endowments

Voluntary income including donations, gifts, legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donations and legacies

Donations and legacies are recognised on a receivable basis when receipt is probable and the amount can be reliably measured.

Grants receivable

Grants are recognised when the charity has an entitlement to the funds and any conditions linked to the grants have been met. Where performance conditions are attached to the grant and are yet to be met, the income is recognised as a liability and included on the balance sheet as deferred income to be released.

Investment income

Investment income is recognised on receipt

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Raising funds

These are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income, the management of investments and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the charity will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted income funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.
