## **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

### **Year ended 31 August 2025**

The directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the company for the period 1 September 2024 to 31 August 2025.

## **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The Buckingham Literary Festival is a registered charity dedicated to promoting literary arts and fostering community engagement through various literary events, workshops, and educational programs. This report provides a comprehensive overview of the charity's financial activities and operational achievements for the fiscal year ending 31st August 2025.

### *Introduction*

The festival aims to enhance cultural literacy, support local authors, and provide accessible literary experiences to diverse audiences. As a registered charity, it operates under the guidance of a trusteeship and adheres to the regulations stipulated by the Charity Commission.

### *Objectives and Activities*

- Organize annual literary festivals featuring renowned authors and speakers.
- Conduct workshops and seminars to promote writing and reading skills.
- Support local schools and community groups through outreach programs.
- Publish and promote local literary works.

### *Financial Overview*

#### **Income**

The primary sources of income for the festival include ticket sales, sponsorships, grants, and donations. In 2025, the total income amounted to £19,378, representing a 19% increase compared to the previous year, primarily driven by increased sponsorship and donations.

#### **Expenditure**

Expenses covered venue hire, artist fees, marketing, educational outreach, and administrative costs. Total expenditure for the year was £17,340, with the largest costs associated with event organization and artist fees.

### *Financial Position*

As of 31st August 2025, the charity's net assets stand at £4,766, reflecting a healthy financial position. The reserve policy ensures sufficient funds are maintained to support future events and unforeseen expenses.

### *Achievements and Impact*

- Successfully hosted the annual festival with over 2,000 attendees.

- Retention of basic ticket price at £10
- Increased community engagement through social media and local partnerships.
- Received positive feedback from participants and stakeholders, emphasizing the festival's role in enriching local cultural life.

#### *Future Plans*

The charity intends to expand its educational programs, increase its outreach to underserved communities, and enhance digital engagement platforms.

#### *Conclusion*

The Buckingham Literary Festival continues to fulfill its mission of promoting literary arts within the community. With sound financial management and strategic planning, the charity is well-positioned to sustain and grow its activities in the coming years.
