The charity aims to continue as a non-profit making body operating to carry out the below:

- To provide capital, training and funding to those communities that would otherwise lack resource and opportunity.
- To relieve financial hardship, distress, and suffering amongst the poor, destitute, homeless and others in need of support.
- To make grants for items, equipment, services, and facilities including the provision of food, other necessities and costs of attending schools.
- To assist in the provision of any charitable service when the opportunity is presented.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

Together for Humanity has been working primarily in the Eastern Province of Zambia to achieve its objectives as set out in its governing document. The charity has been collaborating with charities in Zambia to avoid duplicity in management and administration; thereby giving the maximum benefit to the recipients of the funds. The charity delivered essential aid to the destitute in Zambia through various fundraising projects to assist in the provision of necessities to those who would otherwise lack the resources.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission. We have taken this guidance into account when exercising our powers and duties, making decisions and planning our activities to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit.

The charity is exempt from tax as all its income is charitable and applied for charitable purposes.

None of the trustees received any remuneration or any other benefits from an employment with the charity or a related entity during the current year. No trustee expenses have been incurred.

There have been no related party transactions in the reporting period that require disclosure.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Several projects were completed throughout the year, the following is a brief summary of the achievements and performance:

- Project Qurbani- over 1000 families across various areas in Zambia were provided with food for Eid al Adha.
- Project Iftar Packs – 300 food/iftar packs were distributed in Zambia for families struggling during the month of fasting.
- Project Winter Warmer – 150 students at Lundazi Islamic Centre were provided with pillows, mattresses and blankets
- Project Winter Relief – 500 people were provided with blankets.
- Project Essential Aid – 42 families were provided with essential aid parcels containing necessities such as food, soap, candles and washing powder.
- Project Boreholes – 5 boreholes were constructed in Zambia to deliver safe, sustainable water to local communities.

The charity plans to continue delivering aid to Zambia through similar projects.

The charity operates a minimal reserves policy. The trustees endeavour to distribute all income received in the year to charitable causes. The level of reserves held at the year end is considered to be adequate to continue to support its charitable causes as well as meeting its ongoing support and governance costs. The charity will continue to fundraise and provide donations under its main objectives.

The charity worked with charities in Zambia to complete various grant-making projects and effectively utilise and distribute the funds which were raised. All expenditure was directly incurred in the provision of aid to the needy in Zambia.

The trustees have carefully considered the Charity Commission guidance on investment powers. The trustees adopt a prudent and low-risk approach to the management of funds. The charity's primary objective is to ensure that funds are readily available to support the delivery of food aid, humanitarian assistance, community support projects, and emergency relief activities in Zambia. Accordingly, the charity only holds highly liquid assets such as cash and cash equivalents. The trustees keep the investment policy under periodic review.
