The club has strived to raise the public profile of Inkberrow Bowls Club in the Worcestershire area. This has been achieved by increasing membership, encouraging new members to participate in both friendly and competitive bowls, continued investment in the facilities, well attended Open Day and followed up by a Community Day in September.

New members are warmly welcomed and will have had several chances to participate in the sport before deciding if they wish to join the club or otherwise.

Our playing performance has been mixed in both friendly and league matches but more importantly, members have enjoyed both the physical and social elements the game affords.

Members are encouraged to take part in all areas of the club from cleaning the pavilion, helping with the green preparations, running the indoor short mat as well as preparing and undertaking fund raising events. These social interactions make all members feel part of the friendly, all welcome vibe of the club.

Membership and playing fees have remained competitive and accessible for all.

The club has hosted two county events this year, again raising the awareness of the sport in the local area and the facilities Inkberrow has to offer for players or those considering playing. Members have also represented the club at County tournaments.

This year we were fortunate to secure a grant toward improved equipment to enable the club to better maintain the bowling green.

The trustees have had due regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The charity's principal source of funds is income from members playing bowls. This includes friendly matches, league competitions and membership fees. This has been supplemented by a variety of fundraising events held throughout the year.

Expenditure of £5.1k has been incurred on ensuring the playing surface of the green is suitable for all standards of matches and included the purchase of an eco friendly mower at a cost of £5.0k for which a 70% grant has been secured to be paid to the club in February 2026. Furthermore, an investment has been made in replacing the outdated sprinkler system at a cost of £3.0k. All these expenditures will enable members to continue to play at their chosen level within the club.
