Sainsburys is handing over its Food Programme to FareShare/Olio on 1 July 2026 so it remains to be seen how this plays out with animal charities that have bins in Sainsburys stores. Waitrose, Aldi, Lidl, M&S continue to have a no bins policy.

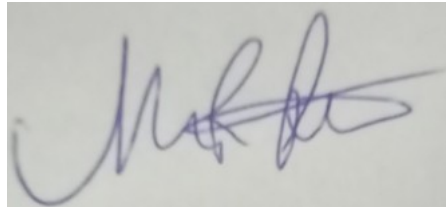
