To support well-being through counselling, exercise, bereavement support, and financial aid. To foster social inclusion and community cohesion through playgroups, events, and local support initiatives.

Para 1.20	As this was the charity's first six months of operation, activities were primarily focused on establishing the charity and commencing its charitable work. During the period, the charity successfully delivered Hifz (Qur'an memorisation) classes, providing beneficiaries with a structured environment to support their learning and engagement with the Qur'an. Whilst the scale of charitable activity was limited during this initial period, the classes contributed to the advancement of education and provided a positive benefit to members of the local community. The trustees expect the charity's impact and range of activities to grow as the organisation continues to develop.
