1. Reference and Administrative Details

Charity trustees

The charity trustees named in the constitution are:

- Rupinder Gidar
- Dipinder Sehgal
- Jaskiran Gidar
- Jaison Jacob
- Sukhvinder Gidar

The trustees are also the only voting members of the CIO under its foundation-model constitution.

2. Structure, Governance and Management

Ravi Gidar Foundation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) using the foundation model, under which the only voting members are the charity trustees. The CIO was registered by the Charity Commission for England and Wales on 7 April 2025.

The charity is governed by its constitution dated 26 February 2025. The trustees manage the affairs of the CIO and may exercise its powers for the purpose of furthering its charitable objects. New trustees are appointed by resolution at a properly convened trustees' meeting, with regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.

The constitution requires at least three trustees. Decisions may be taken at trustees' meetings or, where permitted, by written or electronic resolution. Trustees are required to declare and appropriately manage conflicts of interest.

3. Objectives and Activities

Charitable objects

The objects of Ravi Gidar Foundation are to relieve sickness and to preserve and protect good health for the public benefit of patients, staff and their families particularly within Oxford Hospitals, and to assist social care workers within the United Kingdom by improving their financial, professional and mental wellbeing.

In particular, the constitution enables the Foundation to support these purposes by making grants to Oxford Hospitals Charity for suitable projects, with a focus on equipment, research and facilities in renal, transplant, heart and dementia services, and by making grants to The Care Workers' Charity for suitable projects supporting care workers.

Activities during the year

During the year the trustees focused on fundraising and developing support for Oxford Hospitals Charity and The Care Workers' Charity. The principal fundraising event was the RGF Ball, held at the Royal Lancaster on 14 March 2026 in honour of Ravi Gidar. The evening brought supporters together for music, comedy and insight, with funds raised through attendance donations, online giving and an auction.

The trustees report that the RGF Ball and associated fundraising generated approximately £250,000 overall. The accounts for the year ended 31 March 2026 recognise £169,358.68 of income in the period and separately note a further £100,000 of donations expected after the accounting period.

In planning the Foundation's activities and intended grants, the trustees have had regard to the charity's objects and to delivering public benefit.

4. Achievements and Performance

The Foundation's first full fundraising year established a strong platform for charitable grant-making. The RGF Ball successfully brought together family, friends, supporters and charity partners to celebrate Ravi's legacy while raising substantial funds for the two causes specified in the Foundation's constitution.

Oxford Hospitals Charity

The Foundation worked with Oxford Hospitals Charity with the intention of supporting projects that improve rehabilitation, recovery and long-term patient outcomes across Oxfordshire. Projects identified for support included:

- Transformation of the Independent Living Unit, creating more welcoming rehabilitation spaces to support confidence and independence.
- Renal denervation services supporting innovative treatment for resistant hypertension.
- Renal Transonic equipment to monitor dialysis fistulas and help prevent complications.
- Kidney transplant research aimed at safer and more targeted transplant treatments.
- Interactive RITA technology for patients with dementia to support wellbeing and engagement.
- Comfort packs providing essential items to help vulnerable patients feel more comfortable and dignified in hospital.

The trustees intended to provide a grant of £120,000 to Oxford Hospitals Charity for suitable projects. The accounts identify this as a post-accounting-period grant and therefore it is not included as expenditure in the year ended 31 March 2026.

The Care Workers' Charity

The Foundation also worked with The Care Workers' Charity with the intention of supporting care workers across the UK who face financial hardship and mental health challenges. Areas identified for support included:

- Crisis grants providing rapid financial support to care workers facing sudden hardship, including help with food, rent, utility bills and emergency repairs.

- Mental health and wellbeing support, including access to counselling and wellbeing services.
- Core costs that help sustain essential services, advocacy work and the charity's ability to respond quickly to care workers in need.

The trustees intended to provide a grant of £120,000 to The Care Workers' Charity. The accounts identify this as a post-accounting-period grant and therefore it is not included as expenditure in the year ended 31 March 2026.

5. Financial Review

The financial results for the year are set out in the accompanying accounts. The accounts show:

The accounts also note £100,000 of further donations expected after the accounting period. They separately identify intended grants of £120,000 to The Care Workers' Charity and £120,000 to Oxford Hospitals Charity as post-accounting-period items.

Reserves

As a newly established CIO in its first significant fundraising cycle, the Foundation retained funds at the year end while preparing to make grants in furtherance of its objects. The trustees will keep the level of unrestricted reserves under review, taking account of planned grant commitments, operating costs and the need to manage the charity prudently.

6. Fundraising

Fundraising during the year centred on the RGF Ball on 14 March 2026 at the Royal Lancaster, together with online giving and the event auction. Supporters made donations to attend the event, donated online and participated in the auction. The event was designed both to honour Ravi Gidar and to raise funds for charitable projects aligned with the Foundation's objects.

The trustees report approximately £250,000 raised overall through the Ball and associated fundraising. Income recognised in the accounts for the year was £169,358.68, with a further £100,000 of donations noted as expected after the accounting period.

7. Plans for the Future

Following the successful fundraising year, the trustees intend to progress grant-making to the two charities identified in the Foundation's objects. In particular, the trustees intend to provide grants of £120,000 to Oxford Hospitals Charity and £120,000 to The Care Workers' Charity, subject to the trustees completing their usual grant approval and oversight processes. These grants are shown in the accounts as post-accounting-period items.

The Foundation will continue to raise funds in Ravi Gidar's memory and to identify suitable projects that advance patient care and health outcomes within Oxford Hospitals and improve the financial, professional and mental wellbeing of care workers across the UK.

The Trustees have started to plan new events for fundraising.

8. Trustee Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records and for preparing the charity's accounts, Trustees' Annual Report and annual return in accordance with charity law and the requirements applicable to the CIO. The constitution requires the statements of account, annual reports and returns to be sent to the Charity Commission within the applicable filing period.

The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity, applying its income and property solely towards its charitable objects, and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Objectives and Activities

Aims and Objectives

During the year, the trustees focused on fundraising activities to generate resources for future grant-making in furtherance of these charitable purposes. The trustees are satisfied that the charity's aims, activities and planned grants are carried out exclusively for the public benefit and in accordance with its charitable objects.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

New trustees are provided with a copy of the Constitution and the charity's latest Trustees' Annual Report and financial statements to assist them in understanding their duties and responsibilities.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

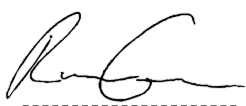

As the charity trustees of the Trust you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").

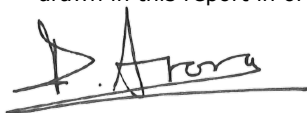

1. General Information

Ravi Gidar Foundation is a charitable incorporated organisation registered with the Charity Commission, registered charity number 1212845. The principal address is 2 Vine Street, First Floor, Uxbridge, UB8 1QE.

2. Accounting Policies

2.1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The accounts have been prepared on the receipts and payments basis in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 and Charity Commission guidance applicable to charities preparing receipts and payments accounts. The Statement of Financial Activities and Statement of Financial Position have been presented voluntarily to enhance the understanding of the charity's financial position. Income and expenditure are recognised when received and paid respectively. No accruals or prepayments have been recognised in these accounts.

2.2. Incoming Resources

Expenditure is recognised when paid and is included in the Statement of Financial Activities on a payments basis.

2.4. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents represent funds held in the charity's bank account and are stated at their carrying value at the reporting date.
