Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	<p>The objective of the Charity is the provision and maintenance of residential property to residents who shall be poor women who:</p> <p>(1) have lived in the County of Leicestershire for a period of ten years, or,</p> <p>(2) have had or have a husband who was either born in the said county or who has lived there for a period of ten years, or</p> <p>(3) have had or have a parent who was either born in the said county or who has lived there for a period of ten years.</p> <p>Preference shall be given to widows or daughters of professional men including artists and literary men.</p>
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	<p>The Charity provides 14 affordable housing units for poor women.</p> <p>The property maintenance contractors are monitored to ensure that general repairs are dealt with to the Trustees' expectations.</p> <p>A waiting list for tenancy is maintained.</p>
Statement confirming whether the trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit	<p>The Trustees confirm that when planning the activities for the year and exercising their duties, they have had due regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.</p> <p>Our objects limit the services we provide to poor women with a connection to Leicestershire but this is deemed to be a sufficient section of the public.</p>

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Achievements and Performance

<p>Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year</p>	<p>SOCIAL EVENTS Due to a natural reluctance to mix socially following the pandemic, it has not been possible to organise social events for the residents this year.</p> <p>PROPERTIES A property manager was appointed during the year and this has proved to be very successful. She now carries out quarterly inspections of all the properties. Some works of improvement have been carried out and it is anticipated that next year major work will be carried out to the main roof and also an upgrade of the shower rooms and central heating systems will be undertaken. Major work to the drains has been completed at a cost in excess of £18,000.</p> <p>Charnwood Lifeline (Charnwood Borough Council) continues to monitor a number of the residents by electronic communications and a weekly Warden visit for those residents who agree to have it. The more active residents have declined to take this up.</p> <p>GROUND Garden contractors continue to maintain the grounds in an excellent manner. A new flower gardener has been contracted as a replacement for the previous one. This has resulted in a much improved look to the flower beds.</p> <p>RESIDENTS All the houses have been fully occupied throughout the year (subject to one house having a change of occupant). Many of the occupants continue to take part in the maintenance of the gardens. The usual half-yearly meetings with the residents during the year have been resumed following Covid.</p>
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Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	<p>The Trustees' Report has been drawn up in accordance with the FRS 102 SORP (2019). The accounts have been drawn up in accordance with CC16 - see accounts on pages 7-10.</p> <p>Cash funds held at 30 June 2022 amounted to £538,011.</p> <p>All 14 available housing units within Burley Houses were fully occupied at the year end.</p>
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	<p>The Trustees maintain the reserves to ensure that day to day running maintenance is covered. In addition, the Trustees maintain a sufficient balance in reserves to meet planned major repairs and maintenance. They are conscious that a major roof repair and upgrade anticipated to cost approximately £200,000 is looming as the main building roof was not included in the previous re-roofing project. The Trustees are permanently aware that with a building of almost 100 years old maintenance is an ongoing feature of the running of the Charity to ensure that residents are as comfortable as possible. Unfortunately the roof work has been delayed by the Coronavirus pandemic.</p>
Amount of reserves held	£538,011
Explanation of any uncertainties about the charity continuing as a going concern	<p>At the time of approving these accounts the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future. The Trustees do not consider there to be any uncertainties about the Charity continuing as a going concern.</p>

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	<p>The Trustee Board considers the risks to which the Charity is exposed and reviews these risks on a regular basis. Key risks are considered to be the safety of the residents on the property and data protection. Systems are in place to mitigate these risks.</p>
Plans for the future	<p>The charity plans continuing the activities outlined above in the forthcoming years subject to satisfactory funding arrangements. Sufficient funds are available for major work to be carried out to repair and upgrade the roof on the main building, and the plumbing work as outlined above as reported last year, it has also become apparent that major work is needed to the pathways around the property but due to illness in our contractor this has been delayed, and it is now hoped that these will all be re-laid during the coming year.</p>

Type of governing document	The Charity is administered and managed by the Trustees subject to the Trust Deed.
How is the charity constituted?	Unincorporated Association. The Trustees had resolved to pursue becoming a Charitable Incorporated Organisation but have now decided to leave the structure as it is and take out insurance to protect the Trustees' position.
Trustee selection methods including details of any constitutional provisions e.g. election to post or name of any person or body entitled to appoint one or more trustees	<p>The body of Trustees when complete shall consist of six competent persons being:</p> <p>Two Nominative Trustees and</p> <p>Four Co-optative Trustees.</p> <p>The Nominative Trustees shall be appointed as follows:</p> <p>One by Leicester City Council and</p> <p>One by Charnwood Borough Council.</p> <p>Appointment of the Trustees is governed by the Trust Deed of the Charity. The Board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new Trustees to fill vacancies arising through resignation or death of an existing Trustee.</p> <p>Each appointment shall be made for a term of four years at a meeting convened and held according to the ordinary practice of the appointing council. The chairman of the meeting shall cause the name of each person appointed to be notified forthwith to the Trustees or their clerk. The person appointed may be but need not be a member of the appointing council.</p> <p>The Co-optative Trustees shall be persons who through residence, occupation or employment, or otherwise have special knowledge of the County of Leicestershire.</p> <p>Every Co-optative Trustee shall be appointed for a term of five years by a resolution of the Trustees passed at a special meeting of which not less than 21 days notice has been given and may be so appointed not more than one month before the term of an existing Co-optative Trustee expires with effect from the date of expiry but so that the latter shall not vote on the matter.</p> <p>Leicester City Council have declined to nominate a Trustee.</p>
