Trustees' report For the year ended 31 December 2025

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The objectives of the Charity are the provision of almshouses for poor persons residing in the ancient parish of Seasalter and making payments to the needy.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Main activities undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit

The activities of the Charity are the management and maintenance of a large house, converted into five self-contained flats, to be used as almshouses, as well as an additional self-contained flat.

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

Trustees

The board of trustees has remained unchanged throughout 2025.

The trustees remain aware of the need to recruit new trustees to increase the boards, knowledge, experience and resilience.

Administration of Charity/Finance

There were no changes concerning the governance of the charity and no need to liaise with the Charity Commission, other than filing the annual return.

The finances of the charity remain healthy.

1. We saw yet another year of investment in the infrastructure of the property. The CMF were again materially reduced, and expense was needed to bring it back to secure amounts.
2. We incurred a significant legal bill of circa £5,000 see below.

Nevertheless, the charity remains on a sound financial basis with a small reduction in available funds.

Residents

The resident of Flat 2 has had to leave as dementia means she is no longer able to look after herself safely. This has meant less income (although this will not be seen recognised in the bank account/accounts until 2026.) The process of the end of the residency was made difficult by the approach of the resident's family necessitating taking legal advice and a review of letters of appointments. This was a significant and unbudgeted expenditure.

The interaction with residents and the charity is in a good state and the residents of Seasalter House met the trustees for an annual Christmas Lunch at Seasalter House. There is regular day to day contact with the residents.

Property(ies)

A significant amount of work has again been undertaken at Seasalter House this year to provide safer access to the rear garden from the house. In addition, the refurbishment of Flat 2 has been undertaken.

The management company at Flat 79 have continued their ongoing programme of maintenance/decoration of the public areas which involved a higher than anticipated service charge. The interior of Flat 79 remains in good condition.

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

The Charity aims to hold sufficient general reserves to cover one year's expenditure, being approximately £40,000. At present general reserves exceed this amount, being £163,928 (2024: £165,530), meaning that the Charity is in a strong position to be able to continue its day-to-day running and to ensure that the accommodation available for residents is well maintained at all times.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

Seasalter Parish Charities was formed on 22 March 1963 and commenced operations on that date. It is a registered charity, number 213940, and is governed by its Scheme of Delegation dated 30 May 1975, which was subsequently amended on 9 September 1987 and 7 February 2022.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Charity Commission Scheme.

Plans for future periods

The Trustees will continue to support the objectives of the charity for the foreseeable future. They are always looking to attract both new Trustees and new Tenants.

Statement of Trustees' responsibilities



They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.



1. General information

Seasalter Parish Charities is a charity registered in England with number 213940. It's principal office is 107 Chestfield Road, Chestfield, Whitstable, Kent CT5 3LT.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

Seasalter Parish Charities meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

The financial statements are presented in British Sterling and rounded to the nearest Pound.

2.2 Going concern

The Trustees assess whether the use of going concern is appropriate i.e. whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the Charity to continue as a going concern. The Trustees make this assessment in respect of a period of at least one year from the date of authorisation for issue of the financial statements and have concluded that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern, thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the Charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.5 Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the institution with whom the funds are deposited.

2.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are initially recognised at cost. After recognition, under the cost model, tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. All costs incurred to bring a tangible fixed asset into its intended working condition should be included in the measurement of cost.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of tangible fixed assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

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2.7 Investments

Fixed asset investments are a form of financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction cost and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance sheet date, unless the value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment. Investment gains and losses, whether realised or unrealised, are combined and presented as 'Gains/(Losses) on investments' in the Statement of financial activities.

2.8 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

2.9 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the Charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the provision is based on the present value of those amounts, discounted at the pre-tax discount rate that reflects the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in the Statement of financial activities as a finance cost.

2.10 Financial instruments

The Charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.11 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds comprise the original endowment assets of the charity, namely the property at 48 Tankerton Road.

Nature and purpose of designated funds

The designated fixed asset fund comprises the charity's non-endowment freehold properties.

The Cyclical Maintenance Fund is to cover the cost of expected material maintenance/repairs to the property. An example of decoration and refurbishment. This is not to be used for minor and/or regular maintenance.

The Emergency Repair Fund is to cover the cost of emergency repairs to the property. That is repairs that are of an unexpected nature, unexpected frequency or an unexpected severity. For example boiler failure during expected lifetime of boiler.

The Asset Fund is to cover the cost of replacement white goods in the residences.

The Alms Fund is to cover the cost of helping the poor in accordance with the aims of the charity (other than running the charity and the almshouses).

Trustees' report For the year ended 31 December 2024

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The objectives of the Charity are the provision of almshouses for poor persons residing in the ancient parish of Seasalter and making payments to the needy.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Main activities undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit

The activities of the Charity are the management and maintenance of a large house, converted into five self-contained flats, to be used as almshouses, as well as an additional self-contained flat.

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

Trustees

The board of trustees has remained unchanged throughout 2024.

The trustees remain aware of the need to recruit new trustees to increase the boards, knowledge, experience and resilience.

Administration of Charity/Finance

There were no changes concerning the governance of the charity and no need to liaise with the Charity Commission, other than filing the annual return. Note because of vacancies in the flats during 2023 the charity's income dropped below £25k and as such we did not need or have an independent review of the accounts for 2023 filed in 2024. We anticipate the need for an independent review for the 2024 accounts.

The finances of the charity remain healthy. We saw yet another year of investment in the infrastructure of the property. The CMF were again materially reduced, and expense was needed to bring it back to secure amounts. The charity remains on a sound financial basis with a small reduction in available funds.

Residents

There has been no change in residents in 2024. All appear to remain to be happy with the accommodation.

The interaction with residents and the charity is in a good state and the residents of Seasalter House met the trustees for an annual Christmas Lunch at Seasalter House. The resident of Flat 79 met the Chair for a Christmas lunch. There is regular day to day contact with the residents.

Property(ies)

A significant amount of work has been undertaken at Seasalter House this year to address the damp on the west wall, with repointing work and a coat of damp prevention on the whole building. In addition, a weather seal on a soil pipe has been replaced. The damp issue is being monitored.

The retaining wall at the front of Seasalter House, onto the neighbour's drive, has been replaced as it was failing and at risk of collapsing.

Following a change in strategy the trustees decided to undertake a rolling programme of redecoration of the residents' flats rather than to address this at the time of change of resident. This meant a greater than anticipated/budgeted maintenance spend in 2024 but is a sound investment.

Achievements and performance (continued)

The management company at Flat 79 have continued their ongoing programme of maintenance/decoration of the public areas which involved a higher than anticipated service charge. The interior of Flat 79 remains in good condition.

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

The Charity aims to hold sufficient general reserves to cover one year's expenditure, being approximately £40,000. At present general reserves exceed this amount, being £165,530 (2023: £173,546), meaning that the Charity is in a strong position to be able to continue its day-to-day running and to ensure that the accommodation available for residents is well maintained at all times.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

Seasalter Parish Charities was formed on 22 March 1963 and commenced operations on that date. It is a registered charity, number 213940, and is governed by its Scheme of Delegation dated 30 May 1975, which was subsequently amended on 9 September 1987 and 7 February 2022.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the Charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Charity Commission Scheme.

Plans for future periods

The Trustees will continue to support the objectives of the charity for the foreseeable future. They are always looking to attract both new Trustees and new Tenants.



1. General information

Seasalter Parish Charities is a charity registered in England with number 213940. It's principal office is 107 Chestfield Road, Chestfield, Whitstable, Kent CT5 3LT.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

Seasalter Parish Charities meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

The financial statements are presented in British Sterling and rounded to the nearest Pound.

2.2 Going concern

The Trustees assess whether the use of going concern is appropriate i.e. whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the Charity to continue as a going concern. The Trustees make this assessment in respect of a period of at least one year from the date of authorisation for issue of the financial statements and have concluded that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern, thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the Charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.5 Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the institution with whom the funds are deposited.

2.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are initially recognised at cost. After recognition, under the cost model, tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. All costs incurred to bring a tangible fixed asset into its intended working condition should be included in the measurement of cost.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of tangible fixed assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

2.7 Investments

Fixed asset investments are a form of financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction cost and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance sheet date, unless the value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment. Investment gains and losses, whether realised or unrealised, are combined and presented as 'Gains/(Losses) on investments' in the Statement of financial activities.

2.8 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

2.9 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the Charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the provision is based on the present value of those amounts, discounted at the pre-tax discount rate that reflects the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in the Statement of financial activities as a finance cost.

2.10 Financial instruments

The Charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.11 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds comprise the original endowment assets of the charity, namely the property at 48 Tankerton Road.

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The objectives of the Charity are the provision of almshouses for poor persons residing in the ancient parish of Seasalter and making payments to the needy.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Main activities undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit

The activities of the Charity are the management and maintenance of a large house, converted into five self-contained flats, to be used as almshouses, as well as an additional self-contained flat.

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

Trustees

The board of Trustees has remained unaltered in 2022. The board recognises the urgent need for new trustees to join on a rolling basis so that there can be continuity on the board when, inevitably, current trustees retire. During the summer an appeal was made for volunteers to join the board of trustees. Initial response was encouraging with three volunteers. Subsequently, two have decided not to progress. Dan Ralph, has however agreed to be a trustee. It is recognised that the recruitment and training of trustees is an ongoing task which has been overlooked in the past.

Administration of Charity/Finance

2022 again saw an improvement in the governance of the Charity. A new scheme was issued by the Charity Commission reconciling the problems identified in the previous year over which legal advice was obtained.

Work was also undertaken in relation to the charity's data protection obligations and an updated handbook was issued to all residents. Work has also been undertaken on the new residents process.

The finances of the charity remain healthy, although the past two years have seen a considerable investment in infrastructure at Seasalter House, and professional advice including fire survey and quinquennial survey all leading to much unbudgeted expenditure meaning that reserves are materially depleted.

Residents

2022 started with the continuing covid issues for all residents and making meeting all of them together a challenge. There was, however, a Christmas lunch this year where all residents and trustees were able to meet.

Two residents sadly died in the last quarter of 2022. Neither flat was ready to advertise for new residents as at the end of 2022 as one flat still contained the previous residents belongings and the trustees have decided to undertake further renovation on the other.

Property(ies)

The issue with the roof on Flat 79 appears to be resolved. The NHBC insurance has accepted the claim so the cost will be limited to the policy excess. The work is effectively complete.

The bathrooms in Flats 4 and 5 were refurbished in the year. This work was more limited than the other three flats (work undertaken in 2021) as the bathrooms were in a better state.

Achievements and performance (continued)

In addition, the laundry room was refurbished (to make it fit for purpose and a new washer and drier were supplied.) A compliant access ramp to the front door was constructed.

Following the fire survey undertaken at the end of 2021 new fire doors were fitted to all the flats at Seasalter House, a new integrated alarm system installed as well as numerous other small jobs that were recommended.

The boilers in Flats 1 and 5 had to be unexpectedly replaced following their annual inspection/service. (The cost of this was taken from the Emergency Repair Fund).

Following the death of the resident in Flat 1 it has been decided to refurbish the kitchen (which is too small) as well as more general decoration. This work will take some time as it involves some structural changes.

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

The Charity aims to hold sufficient general reserves to cover one year's expenditure. At present general reserves exceed this amount, meaning that the Charity is in a strong position to be able to continue its day-to-day running and to ensure that the accommodation available for residents is well maintained at all times.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

Seasalter Parish Charities was formed on 22 March 1963 and commenced operations on that date. It is a registered charity, number 213940, and is governed by its Scheme of Delegation dated 30 May 1975, which was subsequently amended on 9 September 1987 and 7 February 2022.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Charity Commission Scheme.

Plans for future periods

The Trustees will continue to support the objectives of the charity for the foreseeable future. They are always looking to attract both new Trustees and new Tenants.

1. General information

Seasalter Parish Charities is a charity registered in England with number 213940. Its principal office is 107 Chestfield Road, Chestfield, Whitstable, Kent CT5 3LT.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

Seasalter Parish Charities meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

2.2 Going concern

The Trustees assess whether the use of going concern is appropriate i.e. whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the Charity to continue as a going concern. The Trustees make this assessment in respect of a period of at least one year from the date of authorisation for issue of the financial statements and have concluded that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern, thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

Other income is recognised in the period in which it is receivable and to the extent the goods have been provided or on completion of the service.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

2.5 Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the institution with whom the funds are deposited.

2.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are initially recognised at cost. After recognition, under the cost model, tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. All costs incurred to bring a tangible fixed asset into its intended working condition should be included in the measurement of cost.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of tangible fixed assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Freehold property	- Not depreciated.
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2.7 Investments

Fixed asset investments are a form of financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction cost and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance sheet date, unless the value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment. Investment gains and losses, whether realised or unrealised, are combined and presented as 'Gains/(Losses) on investments' in the Statement of financial activities.

2.8 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.9 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the provision is based on the present value of those amounts, discounted at the pre-tax discount rate that reflects the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in the Statement of financial activities as a finance cost.

2.10 Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.11 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds comprise the original endowment assets of the charity, namely the property at 48 Tankerton Road.

Trustees' report for the year ended 31 December 2021

The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021.

Objectives and activities

a. Policies and objectives

The objectives of the Charity are the provision of almshouses for poor persons residing in the ancient parish of Seasalter and making payments to the needy.

In setting objectives and planning for activities, the Trustees have given due consideration to general guidance published by the Charity Commission relating to public benefit, including the guidance 'Public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

b. Main activities undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit

The activities of the Charity are the management and maintenance of a large house, converted into five self-contained flats, to be used as almshouses, as well as an additional self-contained flat.

Achievements and performance

a. Review of activities

Trustees

As anticipated Val Reid resigned as chair and trustee after many years of loyal service. More unexpectedly Dave Remon also retired. The charity expressed its gratitude and gave them a small gift. Joanna Young has joined as a new trustee and agreed to lead the property maintenance and upkeep job. Richard Candy was elected chair.

Administration of Charity/Finance

2021 saw a continuation of the work to improve the governance of the charity. Legal advice was obtained about the extent of any breaches of the charitable schemes and actions to remedy these. This has resulted in communication with the Charity Commission and the expectation of a new scheme to resolve any anomalies. It has also led to a clearer understanding of the assets of the charity with accounts being reported separately between restricted and unrestricted funds. We have also set up separate accounts to record the Extraordinary Repair Fund and Cyclical Maintenance Fund.

The finances of the charity remain healthy. Of note are the sale of one of flat 85 in Swale Park for an amount greater than the book value. The refurbishment of three of the bathrooms in Seasalter House (unbudgeted). The better than budgeted occupancy of the alms houses.

The trustees have also adopted a more formalised system of meetings and agendas to ensure all matters are regularly kept under review. This is helping with the ongoing project of writing, updating, and implementing appropriate policies.

Residents

2021 was again a difficult year because of the Covid pandemic. The residents and the trustees were, nevertheless, able to meet formally to discuss issues generally and in particular: an updated handbook which was received well by all and; news on the long-awaited bathroom refurbishments. It was also a good chance to introduce Joanna to the residents.

The Almshouse(s) have the same residents at the end of the year as at the beginning and all seem to be well considering their ages.

Property(ies)

The sale of flat 85 was completed in 2021.

We were notified of a problem of the roof in the block where flat 79 is situated. This has given rise to an unexpected liability. It is hoped this will be limited to the excess on the building guarantee insurance. The management company are dealing with the issue on behalf of all tenants (including the charity).

The bathrooms in flats 1, 2 and 3 were refurbished in the year to bring them up to an appropriate standard for elderly residents in the 21st century.

A professional fire report was commissioned at Seasalter House. The subsequent report late in 2021 identified several areas that could/should be improved. Work has started on the recommendation but 2022 will see the bulk of that work/expenditure much of which will be unbudgeted.

Financial review

a. Going concern

After making appropriate enquiries, the Trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the accounting policies.

b. Reserves policy

The Charity aims to hold sufficient general reserves to cover one year's expenditure. At present general reserves exceed this amount, meaning that the Charity is in a strong position to be able to continue its day-to-day running.

Structure, governance and management

a. Constitution

Seasalter Parish Charities was formed on 22 March 1963 and commenced operations on that date. It is a registered charity, number 213940, and is governed by its Scheme of Delegation dated 30 May 1975, which was subsequently amended on 9 September 1987.

b. Methods of appointment or election of Trustees

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Charity Commission Scheme.

c. COVID-19

At the time of signing the accounts the Trustees are aware of the potential economic and social effects of the COVID-19 virus outbreak. The full impact of the pandemic on the UK economy is yet to be seen, but the Charity will continue to seek to mitigate this risk by following the UK Government's guidelines and adapting/developing its own internal strategy.



1. General information

Seasalter Parish Charities is a charity registered in England with number 213940. Its principal office is 107 Chestfield Road, Chestfield, Whitstable, Kent CT5 3LT.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair' view. This departure has involved following the Charities SORP (FRS 102) published in October 2019 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

Seasalter Parish Charities meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

2.2 Going concern

The Trustees assess whether the use of going concern is appropriate i.e. whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the Charity to continue as a going concern. The Trustees make this assessment in respect of a period of at least one year from the date of authorisation for issue of the financial statements and have concluded that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern, thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Whilst the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic has been assessed by the Trustees, so far as is reasonably possible, due to its unprecedented impact on the worldwide economy it is difficult to evaluate with any certainty the potential outcomes on the Charity's future activities. However, taking into consideration the Charity's level of reserves, the Trustees believe that the Charity will be able to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

2.3 Income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.4 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

2.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are initially recognised at cost. After recognition, under the cost model, tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. All costs incurred to bring a tangible fixed asset into its intended working condition should be included in the measurement of cost.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of tangible fixed assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Freehold property	- Not depreciated.
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2.6 Investments

Fixed asset investments are a form of financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction cost and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance sheet date, unless the value cannot be measured reliably in which case it is measured at cost less impairment. Investment gains and losses, whether realised or unrealised, are combined and presented as 'Gains/(Losses) on investments' in the Statement of financial activities.

2.7 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

2.8 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

2.9 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the provision is based on the present value of those amounts, discounted at the pre-tax discount rate that reflects the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in the Statement of financial activities as a finance cost.

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.10 Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.11 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds comprise the original endowment assets of the charity, namely the property at 48 Tankerton Road.
