TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2021

The trustees present their report and financial statements of the society for the year ended 30 September 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Charities SORP (FRS 102) Accounting & Reporting by Charities: applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland and the governing document in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the society.

Constitution, structure and objectives

The charity was registered with the Charities Commission on 10 October 1963 under number 219554 and is constituted as an unincorporated society. The rules governing the conduct of the society were adopted on 1 January 1957 and amended on 27 February 1986. A new constitution was adopted at the Annual General Meeting held on 6 March 2003. Copies are available on request.

The main object of the Society is the relief of people with a learning disability in particular relief of learning disabilities for the public benefit. The trustees have reviewed the main objectives of the Society and taken into consideration the Charity Commission general guidance on public benefit.

With this in mind, we have in place the following: A weekly Monday Club, for our more able members, with a varied programme of activities and entertainment. A weekly Wednesday Club, for our more disabled members, with more sedentary pastimes and activities.

In addition, we employ a part time Support Worker who maintains contact with all our disabled members and their families and carers.

These undertakings benefit our disabled members in enabling them to express themselves within a safe and friendly environment and to help them to live as normal life as possible.

Organisation, governance & management

Trustees are appointed at the Society's Annual General Meeting to serve for one year and may be re-appointed at the next one. Trustees normally meet on a monthly basis and the decisions made are recorded in minutes. New Trustees are informed of their legal obligations and report to a Club/Team leader or to the Committee. The Chairman, manages the day-to-day running of the Society, and delegates to others as necessary.

The Society is affiliated to Royal Mencap Society, in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Royal Society, and will observe the terms of affiliation for affiliated members published by the Royal Society from time to time. We seek and receive advice from the Royal Society but not financial support.

Activities and Achievements

During the year under review, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic and related restrictions, no activities took place.

Future Developments

We are always alert to ideas/schemes that could benefit the local members in the Borough.

Review of Financial Results

Income for the year: £169,092 (including £159,767, being a receipt resulting from the beneficial interest under the terms of The George Parkin Will Trust reverting to Maidenhead Mencap on the death of Mr Parkin's son).

Expenditure for the year: £11,390.

Surplus for year £157,702

The charity is considered to be a going concern.

Risks Policy

Our finances are closely supervised to ensure that our reserves are sufficient for our needs. Insurances are in place to cover all our activities and potential liabilities. All necessary checks are carried out on employees, volunteers and helpers before they are engaged.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds, not invested in tangible fixed assets should at least, approximate to one year's expenditure.

Grants Policy

All grants that are made by the Society are discretionary. They must be agreed by the trustees meeting in committee, and meet the objects of the Society.

Investment Policy

The trustees have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds.. Funds are held in two charity savings accounts: with Virgin Money and Cambridge and Counties Bank. These accounts have full protection under the FSCS (Financial Services Compensation Scheme).

The monies from the George Parkin Will Trust are held as a separate fund pending decisions on its' distribution.

**NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2021**

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Ireland (effective 1 January 2015) and with the Charities Act 2011.

1.2 Incoming resources

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received.

Donations, legacies and other forms of voluntary income and related gift aid are recognised as incoming resources when receivable, except insofar as they are incapable of financial measurement.

1.3 Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised on an accruals basis.

Grants payable are recognised in the accounts when the trustees have made a commitment to the payment.

Expenses are charged to the unrestricted fund unless specifically identifiable with the restricted fund.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Furniture and Equipment	10% straight line on cost
Minibus	20% straight line on cost

1.5 Income Funds

Designated funds are part of the unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for a particular project or use, without restricting or committing the funds legally. The designation may be cancelled by the trustees if they later decide that the charity should not proceed or continue with the use or project for which the funds were designated.

1.6 Financial Instruments

Financial assets are recognised at transaction cost and where appropriate at amortised cost. Financial liabilities are recognised at transaction cost.
