The charity has maintained its property in a safe and suitable condition for access and use (for the above purposes) by both regular attenders and the public in general. Discussions took place with a view to The Vale Hall being used by others within the terms of the Trust Deed. In arranging necessary repairs and maintenance, the Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The Trust is not primarily in the business of making grants and none was made during the relevant year. The Trustees endeavour to balance the advantage of having ready resources to meet expenditure with the potential benefit of interest to be earned by putting money away for a while. An interest-earning savings account has been maintained with a building society during the year. A good deal of maintenance activity, especially relating to the outside of the premises, has been carried out voluntarily by attenders or funded from local collections. This has lessened the call on Trust funds. The Trustees do not receive any remuneration and claimed no expenses during the relevant year.

The Trust has kept a close eye on maintenance of the fabric and Health and Safety aspects of the two meeting halls for which it is responsible.

The annual accounts show a slight decrease in rental income and an increase in building insurance and maintenance. The Trust's funds have, however, been substantially increased by a transfer in September 2024 from another trust with similar objectives, which has ceased operation.

A contract was entered into for the rectification of extensive damage at The Vale Hall in Coulsdon due to a water leak. These works were commenced in the 2024/2025 financial year but continued into the current year. The whole cost has been defrayed from insurance.

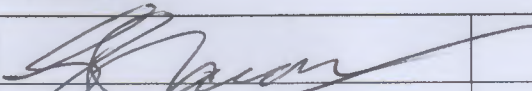

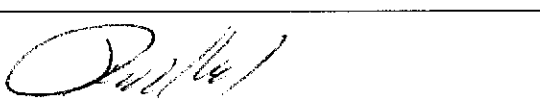
