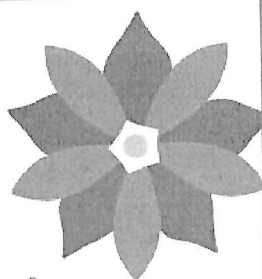

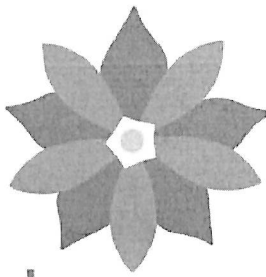

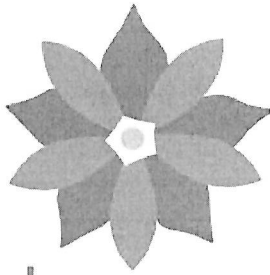
A special thanks to our Trustees, who provide invaluable advice and hold the history that built and the strength of our charity.

ACHIEVEMENTS & PERFORMANCE

FOR APPROACHING 90 YEARS THE FRIENDS HAS BEEN SUPPORTING THE WORK OF THE HOSPITAL NOT ONLY BY FUNDRAISING BUT PERHAPS MORE IMPORTANTLY, BY PROVIDING VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE IN VARIOUS AREAS:

THE SHOP

The Friends Shop continues to be a real success story, opening regularly Monday to Saturday with a strong and enthusiastic team of over 40 volunteers who dedicate their time and hard work to the selling of essential items, food, snacks, gift items and hot drinks to patients, carers, and staff.

Thanks to its refurbishment in 2020 coupled with the hard work and the enthusiasm of the volunteers, the dedication of the Manager Katie Sketchley, the help of Helen Moran, Linda Wimble and all the buying team, the shop continues to grow and to be of service to an ever-growing number of customers.

The shop has become a major source of revenue: totalling with the trolley £147,000 yearly gross income in 2023 compared to £115,000 in 2022. With a net income of £63,000 it has widened its range of products, offered a number of healthy choices and catering for many dietary requirements.



THE SHOP TROLLEY

The Trolley provides a regular and much welcome service visiting wards, sometimes twice daily, to provide all the shop amenities to in-patients, outpatients, their carers, and busy staff.

The team of 14 volunteers headed by Sally Robotham is always welcomed with friendly and appreciative smiles and is often a source of friendly chat and much needed comfort.



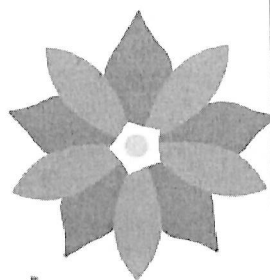
THE CAFE'

The Friends Café has now fully returned to its former glory, with china mugs and plates also re-introduced in 2023. Many new volunteers have joined an already busy team, now counting over 60 people, and are making daily fresh sandwiches as well as serving coffees and teas. The new teams had the opportunity to meet in November when an evening of nibbles and drinks was organised by the Manager Sarah Laidlaw.

The café continues to grow and in 2023 has recorded a yearly gross income of £56,000 and net income of £24,000. The ranges of food sold are widening with an emphasis in giving variety and offering more healthy choices: including fruit pots, granolas, and rice cakes as well as hot soups and pasties, delicious cakes, and sandwiches. And always trying to offer very good value for money to be of benefit to patients and staff alike.

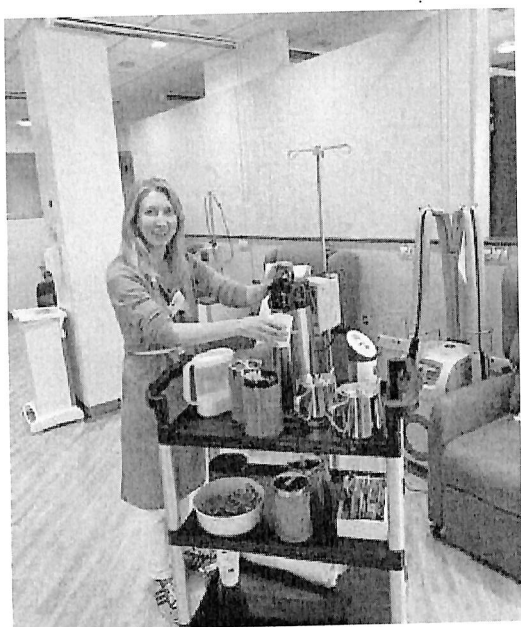
FLOWERS & GARDEN

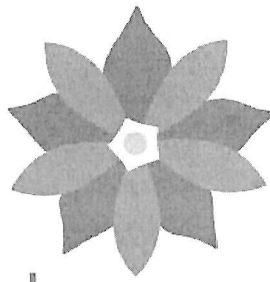

These sales have provided a great source of extra income for the Friends and in 2023 have totalled nearly £2000.

This is an area where the Friends' help and care can really make a patient's day more bearable with a higher level of comfort. We have a team of 16 volunteers who regularly visit Horder ward.



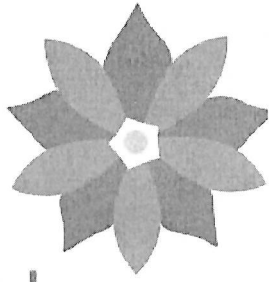
ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT IN CCU & MDU

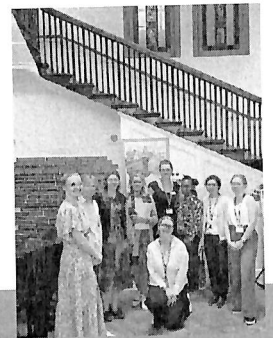

COFFEE MACHINES

THE PIANO, THE ARTS FORUM & THE AQUARIUMS

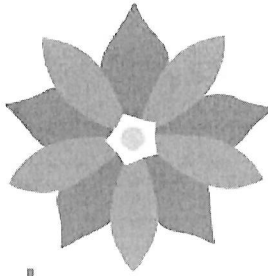


We are proud to have a team of 7 pianists, coordinated by our Hon. President June Torrance. They regularly play the Steinway piano at the base of the Regency staircase, creating a soothing atmosphere as patients and family arrive at Royal Marsden, Chelsea. There have been many special moments shared by the Regency staircase where the sound echoes through the corridors.

The Friends have also contributed £6000 to the Arts Forum to support the acquisition and maintenance of art on display, art projects for staff, music sessions in wards, a number of concerts taking place in the chapel, a choir open to staff and volunteers and art packs which are distributed in wards and so gratefully received.

The Friends also provide funds for the upkeep of the Aquariums in Outpatients and Radiotherapy, which were donated to the Royal Marsden over a decade ago.

RECRUITMENT

At the heart of the Friends recruitment campaign has been Mel Bowker who has helped enormously with the recruitment and processing of tens of new volunteers.



An ad campaign was run in Spring 2023 which proved very successful and resulted in the recruitment of 30 more volunteers just in the last 6 months.

Mel has been an absolute gem, working tirelessly to make the recruitment process very efficient. By the end of 2023 we had nearly 180 active volunteers.

VOLUNTEERS

A Team of 178 active volunteers who in 2023 have dedicated around 36,000 hours of service to the Friends of the Royal Marsden, Chelsea. The Trust set up a Volunteers Voices Forum, a first within the NHS, which is open to all volunteering groups within the hospital, to submit feedback that will improve the patients' experience.

Volunteers have a responsibility to be fully trained and up to date with all the learning and e-learning modules required by the Trust. This also enables them to be fully aware of what is expected of them in certain situations when dealing with emergencies, care for those in need and confidentiality. The Friends have a high level of compliance, and we are proud of this result as we understand that this is achieved with no small effort.



SECRETARIAL SUPPORT

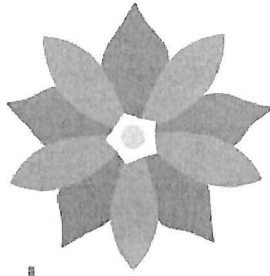

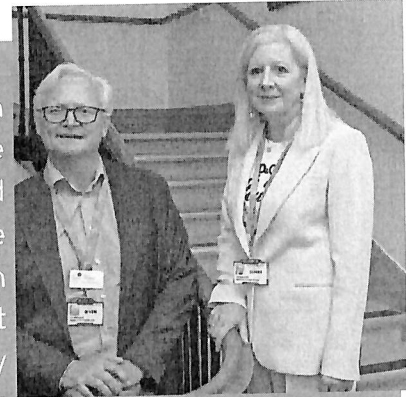
In 2023 the link to our Grant scheme was added so that Hospital requests for fundings could be sent using a set application form through our site.

They attend regular meetings to evaluate and approve hospital requests for funding. Their role is extremely important to the Charity.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

In 2023, the gross income of the Friends of The Royal Marsden, Chelsea (FORMC) increased by 68%, with the net income increasing by 105% from £81,298 to £166,140. The main drivers of this improvement were as follows (all in £):

- Income from subscriptions and donations was 12% higher in 2023, £76,671 against £68,448 in 2022.
- Fundraising events raised £42,672 in 2023 against £71,284 in 2022. The difference is principally attributable to the absence of a Summer Drinks Party in 2023.
- As set out in the table on page 14, FORMC provided amenities and equipment worth £229,486 in 2023 against £110,473 in 2022. In addition, FORMC had committed, as at 31st December 2023, to provide additional equipment and amenities worth £51,729.
- We received three legacies in 2023, one for £36,250, another for £150,000 and a third for £25,000.

In 2023 FORMC, Friends of the Royal Marsden, Chelsea has have received a high number of requests by the Royal Marsden Hospital.

The top table to the left is listing all equipment and services funded and it has been compiled to show the number of different departments our grants have been able to reach.

The second table shows the annual commitments and charitable expenditures incurred to fund the various services the Friends offer.

By 31/12/2023 FORMC had committed a further £51,729.

Financial Position at the Year End

FORMC continues to remain in a strong financial position at the year-end with a 19% increase in Accumulated Funds from £873,190 at 31st December 2022 to £1,039,330 at 31st December 2023.

Charitable spend increased to £229,486, more than double the previous year. Cash and deposits at year end are £934,000, a 4% increase from £895,000 at 31st December 2022. This strong cash position will help to ensure that the Friends continue to fulfil the objects of the Charity as stated on page 3.

Reserves Policy

Generally, the Restricted and Unrestricted funds of FORMC are available to be spent as the Trustees and Committee decide, the only exceptions being as follows:

- Restricted funds – the funds provided by the Campbell-Paterson Will Trust must be spent on purchases of medical equipment.

After taking the above into account, FORMC does not formally hold any reserves. However, it does aim to maintain a level of funds at a minimum of £250,000. The Trustees believe that this will enable the Charity to meet its responsibilities and to ensure that it continues to operate on a 'Going Concern' basis.

Structure, Governance and Management

FORMC is governed by the Objects and Rules as amended and altered by the members of FORMC at the Extraordinary General Meeting on 29th November 2007 and effective from 1st January 2008

The Objects and Rules have been amended and re-registered by the Charities Commission on the 6th November 2015. Trustees are nominated by the Committee of FORMC and shall comprise the President of FORMC and a minimum of three members nominated by the Committee for appointment at the Annual General Meeting. The trustees have delegated the conduct and management of the affairs of FORMC to the Committee in accordance with the Objects and Rules.

Remuneration to Charity Trustees

FORMC paid no remuneration or other benefits in kind to a Charity trustee.

Relationships with other Charities

The Royal Marsden NHS Foundation Trust has its own fundraising charity which concentrates on major capital projects and the support of research funds. The trustees of FORMC consider that the income generating activities of their charity, as operated by the dedication of its volunteers, in providing highly visible services, are complementary to the work of the main hospital charity.

A significant number of volunteers are recruited from former patients and their families and friends. FORMC meets from time to time with the Friends of other large London hospitals to discuss matters of common interest and to share ideas for providing services and fundraising.

Trustees Responsibilities in Relation to the Financial Statements

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year which gives a true and fair view of the situation of the Charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the Charity for that period. In preparing these Financial Statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.
- Observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2019 (FRS 102)
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the Financial Statements
- Prepare the Financial Statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charities (accounts and reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the Trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.



INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF FRIENDS OF THE ROYAL MARSDEN CHELSEA

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Friends of the Royal Marsden Chelsea (the 'charity') for the year ended 31 December 2023 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance sheet and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the charitable company's affairs as at 31 December 2023 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and

Basis for opinion

We are independent of the charitable company in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the United Kingdom, including the Financial Reporting Council's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Conclusions relating to going concern

We have nothing to report in respect of the following matters in relation to which the ISAs (UK) require us to report to you where:

- the Trustees' use of the going concern basis of accounting in preparation of the financial statements is not appropriate; or

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

Friends of The Royal Marsden, Chelsea is an unincorporated Charity registered in England. The address of the registered office is given in the Charity information on page 4 of these Financial Statements.

The Charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011, and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The Financial Statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The Financial Statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the Charity and rounded to the nearest £.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these Financial Statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

1.2 Fund Accounting

Unrestricted Funds are funds that are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees to advance the general objectives of the Charity and that have not been designated for other purposes.

There is one Restricted Fund, the WL Campbell-Paterson Will Trust, under which the FRMC is required to use all income from the Trust to provide medical equipment to The Royal Marsden NHS Foundation Trust.

1.3 Accounting Policies

INCOMING RESOURCES:

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when FORMC is entitled to the income and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability. Legacies are included when the Friends are advised by the personal representative of an estate that payment will be made, or property transferred and the amount involved can be quantified.

Where incoming resources have related expenditure, as with fundraising, the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the Statement of Financial Activities.

Donations are only included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the Charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the Statement of Financial Activities at the same time as the gift to which they relate.

Donated services and facilities are only included in incoming resources, with an equivalent amount in resources expended, where the benefit to the Charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material.

The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the Charity of the service or facility received. The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the Trustees' Annual Report. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable.

RESOURCES EXPENDED:

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and included under expense categories that aggregate costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities, they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

VALUE ADDED TAX:

Income and Expenditure are shown net of recoverable VAT.

ASSETS:

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year and cost more than £500. They are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:

Café equipment - 25% straight line over four years;
Café refurbishment and Shop refurbishment - 10% straight line over ten years.
Stocks are valued at the lower of cost or market value.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS:

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised in the balance sheet when the charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Trade and other debtors and creditors are classified as basic financial instruments and measured at initial recognition at transaction price. Cash and cash equivalents are classified as basic financial instruments and comprise cash in hand and at bank. Financial liabilities are classified in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into and the definitions of a financial liability.

1.3 Accounting Policies (continued)

GRANT INCOME:

Grant income is recognised under the accrual model of Financial Reporting Standard 102. Grant income is recognised in the profit and loss account on a systematic basis over the period in which the charity recognises the related costs for which the grant is intended to compensate.

GOING CONCERN:

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Trustees have reviewed and considered the consequences of Covid-19 and other events and conditions, and have determined that they do not create a material uncertainty that casts significant doubt upon the entity's ability to continue as a going concern.

OPERATING LEASE AGREEMENTS:

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

PENSION COSTS:

The charity provides the staff with the benefit of a defined contribution pension which is paid into either the charity pension scheme or a scheme of their choice. The scheme is managed, and their assets are held, by independent managers. The pension charge represents contributions due from the charity and amounted to £163 (2022: £162). Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged in the period to which they relate.

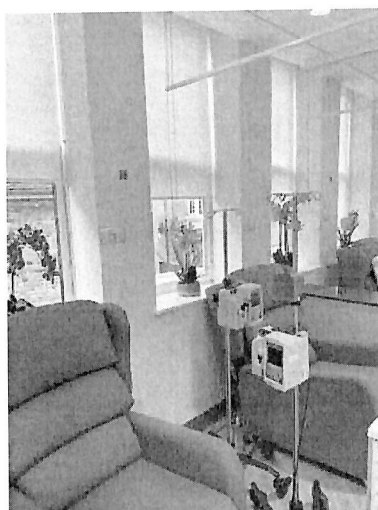
Every member undertakes to contribute to the charity in the event of it being wound up whilst she / he is a member or within one year afterwards, for the payment of debts and liabilities of the company contracted before she / he ceases to be a member and the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for the adjustment of the rights of contributories among themselves such amount as may be required not exceeding one pound.

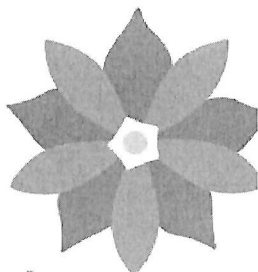
