Trustees' Report

The trustees present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021.

Objectives and activities

Objects and aims

The charity's main aim is to support the religious and other charitable works carried out by members of the order both in this country and overseas.

The charity is for charitable purposes connected with the Roman Catholic religion both in England and its missions around the world. The funding is mainly the surplus from the provision of playgroup activities and fees received from the hostel.

Objectives, strategies and activities

MONTEVIDEO (URUGUAY)

In Montevideo, Uruguay, the Sisters of Maria Bambina are carrying out project "Growing Up Together", a project in agreement with INAU (Institute Of The Child And Adolescent Of Uruguay) in which they take care of 50 children from families that mostly come from neighbourhoods with limited resources and families in a situation of great vulnerability, with informal jobs.

The project "Family Baskets" which is carried out by the sisters and the staff who prepare family baskets, including basic food products, personal hygiene, and cleaning items for each of the families of the 50 children. The children are also provided lunch at the canteen at approximate cost of 120 Pesos per child.

In order to help and promote basic hygiene of the children, two new showers will be installed as part of the "Hygiene and Health of The Body" project.

Our sisters render service without prejudice to caste, creed, religion, cultural background, to uphold the human dignity and assist them even in their painful situation, to live in peace and with courage. The sisters bring professional expertise, in nursing and pastoral health care as they work in hospitals, clinics and rest homes. In leprosy centres and dispensaries, in centres for TB and Aids patients, in centres for the physically or mentally disabled, in families and villages.

The Charity considers that it satisfactorily achieved its objectives and aims during the year and anticipates the same in the forthcoming year.

THE SANCTUARY - LOVERE (ITALY)

We continue to help with the restoration of the Chapel of the Origins. This Chapel was originally built in 1830's and is now incorporated into the larger Sanctuary dedicated to our Saints - St Capitanio, our Foundress and St Gerosa, her first companion.

This Sanctuary is always open for the public and many people from the locality and other places come to visit, participate in Holy Mass and Prayers. The people of the place are very much devoted to come to the Sanctuary because the two Saints are from the same place and the same parish. The chapel requires intervention to make the structure safe.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

During this year, we had the opportunity to offer help to Ealing Abbey Mission, Cafod and Cardinal Hume centre. Also during the year we were able to help the Bible Network, The Pontifical mission Peter's Pence, Aid to the Church in need, Aged and retired priests locally, Vincent de Paul Society, International Faith outreach supporting prisoners in their faith and Cafod candlelight funds.

Apart from these we had the joy of sharing in kind (vegetables, fruits, clothes, furniture etc) with our neighbouring religious communities and the poor families whom we know.

Around the world our sisters work with people of different cultures and religions and take well considered initiatives in various areas of education, in institutions, in non-formal education in open school and professional training (technical and commercial schools such as domestic science, needle work). They work in therapeutic communities, rehabilitation centres and residential homes providing professional nurses and health care to which help and support has been given accordingly.

Our sisters render service without prejudice to caste, creed, religion, cultural background, to uphold the human dignity and assist them even in their painful situation, to live in peace and with courage. The sisters bring professional expertise, in nursing and pastoral health care as they work in hospitals, clinics and rest homes. In leprosy centres and dispensaries, in centres for TB and Aids patients, in centres for the physically or mentally disabled, in families and villages.

The Charity considers that it satisfactorily achieved its objectives and aims during the year and anticipates the same in the forthcoming year.

Achievements and performance

The Charity considers that it satisfactorily achieved its objectives and aims during the year and anticipates the same in the forthcoming year.

Financial review

The income for the year totalled £191,869 (£198,679 in 2020) and expenses of £174,606 (£192,899 in 2020). The Charity had a surplus of £51,967 (deficit £48,655 in 2020).

Further information is available on the Statement of Financial Activity.

Policy on reserves

The trustees are satisfied with the financial position. Reserves are at a level which is considered sufficient for the Charity to fulfil its obligations for at least six months.

Structure, governance and management

Nature of governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a declaration of trust dated 27th November 1959.

The charity is registered as The Sisters of Charity of Saint Capitanio and Saint Gerosa.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Were there to be a requirement for new trustees, these would be identified and appointed by the mother house in Italy.

The new trustees would be made aware of their responsibilities, the governing document, administrative procedures, the history and the approach of the Charity.

Organisational structure

There are currently three trustees.

Major risks and management of those risks

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The Trustees have conducted their own review of the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. These systems are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Charity.



1 Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Basis of preparation

The Sisters of Charity of St Capitanio and St Gerosa meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

The charity opted to early adopt Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016 and have therefore not included a cash flow statement in these financial statements.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Income and endowments

Voluntary income including donations, gifts, legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donations and legacies

Donations and legacies are recognised on a receivable basis when receipt is probable and the amount can be reliably measured.

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Raising funds

These are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income, the management of investments and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Governance costs

These include the costs attributable to the charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and trustees's meetings and reimbursed expenses.

Taxation

The charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Asset class	Depreciation method and rate
Motor Vehicles	Reducing balance - 20%
Buildings	Fully depreciated.

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments, other than programme related investments, are included at market value at the balance sheet date. Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and their market value at the start of the year, or their subsequent cost, and are charged or credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period of disposal.

Unrealised gains and losses represent the movement in market values during the year and are credited or charged to the Statement of Financial Activities based on the market value at the year end.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees's discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds set aside for specific purposes at the discretion of the trustees.

**REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2020**

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Charity considers that it satisfactorily achieved its objectives and aims during the year and anticipates the same in the forthcoming year.

The charity is for charitable purposes connected with the Roman Catholic religion both in England and its missions around the world. The funding is mainly the surplus from the provision of playgroup activities and fees received from the hostel.

Public Benefit

The Sisters have complied with their duty according to Section 17(5) of the Charities Act 2011. To achieve this the Charity reports that it offers the following Public Benefit.

The charity is for charitable purposes connected with the Roman Catholic religion both in England and its missions around the world. The funding is mainly by the surplus from the provision of playgroup activities and fees received from the hostel.

MONTEVIDEO (URUGUAY)

In Montevideo, Uruguay, the Sisters of Maria Bambina are carrying out project "Family Basket" in which they take care of 115 children from families that mostly come from neighbourhoods with limited resources and families in a situation of great vulnerability, with informal jobs.

In March, like everyone else, they were affected by the Covid-19 pandemic, which meant, as of March 16, the closure of all face-to-face activities in the institution.

The project "Family Baskets" which is carried out by the sisters and the staff who prepare weekly family baskets, including basic food products, personal hygiene and cleaning items for each of the families, at an approximate cost of 1400 Uruguayan pesos.

MONTEVIDEO (URUGUAY)

In Montevideo (Uruguay) we are supporting the Virgin Nina Cultural Association in carrying out two projects with children, aged 0-3 and 5-12. These activities are carried out in an old building with little maintenance. We have supported with aid to fix the ceiling of three classrooms, damp and maintenance.

Public Benefit

THE SANCTUARY – LOVERE – ITALY

We have helped with the restoration of the Chapel of the Origins. This Chapel was originally built in 1830's and is now incorporated into the larger Sanctuary dedicated to our Saints – St Capitanio, our Foundress and St Gerosa, her first companion.

This Sanctuary is always open for the public and many people from the locality and other places come to visit, participate in Holy Mass and Prayers. The people of the place are very much devoted to come to the Sanctuary because the two Saints are from the same place and the same parish. The chapel requires intervention to make the structure safe.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

During this year, we had the opportunity to offer help to Oxfam, Cafod and Cardinal Hume centre. Also during the year we were able to help the Bible Network, The Pontifical mission Peter's Pence, Aid to the Church in need, Aged and retired priests locally, Vincent de Paul Society, International Faith outreach supporting prisoners in their faith and Cafod candlelight funds. We also help at the soup kitchen in West Ealing and help at a local care home.

In considering the needs of the families who come to our playgroup, of which two of the families expressed their financial difficulties were given help with complete childcare costs this year.

Those students who have had difficulty in finding jobs were given information of job opportunities in the locality and given concession in paying their accommodation fees in our hostel.

Apart from these we had the joy of sharing in kind (vegetables, fruits, clothes, furniture etc) with our neighbouring religious communities and the poor families whom we know.

Around the world our sisters work with people of different cultures and religions and take well considered initiatives in various areas of education, in institutions, in non-formal education in open school and professional training (technical and commercial schools such as domestic science, needle work). They work in therapeutic communities, rehabilitation centres and residential homes providing professional nurses and health care to which help and support has been given accordingly.

Our sisters render service without prejudice to caste, creed, religion, cultural background, in order to uphold the human dignity and assist them even in their painful situation, to live in peace and with courage. The sisters bring professional expertise, in nursing and pastoral health care as they work in hospitals, clinics and rest homes. In leprosy centres and dispensaries, in centres for TB and Aids patients, in centres for the physically or mentally disabled, in families and villages.

The Charity considers that it satisfactorily achieved its objectives and aims during the year and anticipates the same in the forthcoming year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The income for the year totalled £198,679 (£213,236 in 2019) and expenses of £192,899 (£236,058 in 2019). The Charity had a net deficit of (£48,655) (surplus £21,887 in 2019). Further information is available on the Statement of Financial Activity.

Reserves policy

The trustees are satisfied with the financial position. Reserves are at a level which is considered sufficient for the Charity to fulfil its obligations for at least six months

Investments are held in the form of an M & G Charifund. During this year the bond investment decreased in value, the value at 31st December 2020 was £259,402 (2019: £313,836).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a declaration of trust dated 27th November 1959.

The charity is registered as The Sisters of Charity of Saint Capitanio and Saint Gerosa.

Organisational structure, recruitment and appointment of new trustees

There are currently three trustees. Were there to be a requirement for new trustees, these would be identified and appointed by the mother house in Italy. The new trustees would be made aware of their responsibilities, the governing document, administrative procedures, the history and the approach of the Charity.



1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Buildings are fully depreciated.

Motor vehicles

These are depreciated at a rate of 20% on a reducing balance basis.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Investments

Investments are included in the accounts at the current market value.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
