

2024 was a very busy year for us. Two new Sisters joined us for the mission – one from Congo and another from Vietnam. This enabled us to increase our engagement in a variety of ways.

Training

We attended several Training Days organised by the Conference for Religious Communities:

- Governance Meeting re Civil and Canon Law relating to Charities
- Financial and property management planning meeting
- Workshop on Visas for Charity Workers/Ministers of Religion
- Meetings with other Charity Leaders for shared advice
- One Sister completed her Theology Studies with an Irish Religious Institute, and another attended a Theology Programme in London
- Two Sisters attended English Lessons to facilitate their pastoral work.

The Convent Chapel was used more extensively for the following events:

We held several Retreat Days for the local population on the following topics:

- How do we read the Bible
- Waiting on God - Advent
- Following the Star – Christmas
- Who am I? - Summer

In addition, there were weekly liturgical celebrations attended by an increasing number of people/ some join us for our regular times of Prayer during the week.

As part of the Province of Europe, several Members attended meetings (one of our sisters being a Provincial Counsellor means she must attend meetings across Europe)

One Sister returned to Congo for health reasons/One for family holiday

Repairs to properties and Planning for the Future

- It was necessary to undertake several repairs during the year
- Lead replacement on Roof in House No. 23
- Damp-course and re-plastering of wall in Sitting room with replacement of electrical points
- Replacement of burst Water Tank in House No. 20
- **With a view to future:** Major transformation of what was a "garage/Library" into a bedroom with en-suite facilities to receive guests and eventually with a view for use of elderly sisters unable to climb stairs to bedrooms. This work to be completed during 2025.

On the whole we consider the year was a satisfactory one and that we remained faithful to our Mission as a Charity.



The properties 20 and 23 Higham Station Avenue were purchased in 1972 by the UK province but have only now been recognised in the accounts as they were previously thought to belong to the General Provicilate in France but recent confirmation from France and inspection of title deeds confirm otherwise. We do not have any accounting records dating back to 1972 to confirm the original cost so we have relied up Sr Josephine Canny confirmation that the properties were purchased for £25,000 each and bout had substantial repair work of around £25,000 each to bring the properties into habitable order. The house are relected at cost in the financial statements.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Social and Spiritual

We continued our educational and social care work throughout the year following the arrival of two new Sisters, one who had been working in Jerusalem for 11 years as a Theologian and a Vietnamese who had been posted to one of our schools in France for a period of 10 years. This facilitated several developments due to the fact that they are bi-lingual which permitted visits to families with whom we had less contact than previously. They are attending lessons in the local college to improve their English language skills.

One Sister works as a Carer in a local Care Home where she also acts as Chaplain and another works as Chaplain in a large Secondary School within the Diocese.

Two of our elderly Sisters are cared for within the community and we invited elderly members of the local community for lunches.

We estimate that the community made approximately 20 weekly visits to the elderly and vulnerable in our local community as well as receiving approximately 35 individual visits over the year from people seeking spiritual help or counsel.

A weekly mass on Wednesdays was attended by another group and meetings for lay associates also met several times.

One Sister directed Retreats for interns from the Centre for Theology and Community, Sixth Formers as well as for groups who met for Days of Recollection throughout the year within our Convent. She also attended the Profession of Vows for another Religious Order in her capacity as Vicar for Religious of Brentwood Diocese.

Justice and Peace work

One Sister was invited to speak to Secondary School pupils from across the Diocese in relation to the Church's Social Teaching for Justice and Peace; attend a Justice and Peace International Meeting of the Oblates via zoom, met with staff and Leaders from The East London Communities Organisation (TELCO) and several members attended the 27th anniversary Assembly of London Citizens.

Ecumenical and Inter-Faith

Since our foundation in the UK at the outset of the 20th century, the community has continually engaged in ecumenical work with other church and since the 60's with Inter-Faith communities. We see this as a means of weaving the fabric of our society since we were established to work for Unity among the peoples with whom we live.

In this respect one of our Sisters delivered training sessions for interns and staff working and engaging with the Centre for Theology and Community where a Sister delivered training sessions

We attended:

- and Spoke with a group of Jewish Rabbis
- attended a Muslim wedding
- visited an Orthodox Monastery

Administrative work

Two Sisters attended:

- a 2 week European Provincial Meeting in Brussels
- A Provincial Meeting in Nimes, France
- Training Meetings for Religious Leaders in the UK (to update our understanding of Civil Law; Church Canon Law, Financial Management and Management of Buildings.)
- Attended Trustee meetings for CTC and as a Chaplain delivered Leadership Training Sessions for attendees, combined with the spiritual accompaniment of several of their staff/interns.

We also held our annual Garden Party in aid of our Orphanage in the Congo as a gesture of solidarity with our Sisters working across the world.

In short, we were satisfied that our work this year corresponded with the intention for which our Charity exists and are grateful for the many volunteers and associates who helped us deliver it.

Apart from our “bread and butter” work of visiting the sick and housebound to care for their spiritual needs – a service very much welcomed by those who had been isolated for so very long, we made provision for those who live locally to join us in our chapel for prayer at regular times. One of our Sisters works in a local Care Home for the elderly and is therefore very much in touch with local people which is important for us in terms of our mission to help weave the fabric of our society. In the same vein, we celebrated Eid and Diwali with our neighbours.

We continued our Chaplaincy work in both a Secondary College and in collaboration with the Centre for Theology and Community, interviewing possible candidates for our internships, leading retreats for Interns, participating in Leadership Training Programmes and meeting with an important number of people in one-to-one sessions for either Counselling or Spiritual development.

This work also entailed sessions with Pentecostal Churches and Prisons as well as attendance at Citizens Assemblies in keeping with the Social Teaching of the Church. One of our members is also a Trustee on their Board.

Due to the pandemic when many lost their jobs or found themselves in situations of bereavement, a fair amount of our time was spent in meeting with these people, counselling and encouraging them in whatever way we could. Fortunately it was possible to continue with the use of our garden which provided safe spaces when needed

We ran ad hoc Days of Recollection for our Associates, Young Adults and also for Confirmation Programmes when requested.

In terms of our own members, we had a young women who joined us this year for initial training as a Sister and a great deal of time was naturally invested in this (which entailed travelling to France sometimes on a monthly basis for specialist training sessions). One of our members also travelled to the Dem.Rep. Of Congo where she visited several of our communities, some of which we support financially. On her return she unfortunately had to be quarantined in a hotel for a 10 day period. We continue with the care of one of our elderly members who suffers from Alzheimers.

At a Diocesan level, we continued our work as Vicar for Religious for the Diocese of Brentwood, organising gatherings with the Bishop, participated in the Bishops Council and were named as a Committee member to set up junior choirs in local Catholic Schools linking them with their Parish communities.

We were happy with what we accomplished on the whole although we did not find it possible to continue with the Garden Parties where we usually try to generate finance to help our Orphanage in Congo.



Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Corona Virus Pandemic coloured the approach to our work during the year. Much of our work took place via Zoom which made it possible to deliver certain programmes we would normally run in person. We also invested in two Gazebos which made it possible for us to meet with people outdoors and at a safe distance. Those of us who work in the caring profession continued despite the risks, taking advantage of the Vaccination Programme as soon as it was available.

Many of the people who would normally benefit from our services could not, of course, come in person and so we made a point of walking around the locality each evening and knocking on the doors of those whom we knew to be isolating; without entering their homes we kept in touch ensuring they were OK. Others were contacted by telephone on a weekly basis.

We were joined during the year by one of our sisters returning from Missionary Territory and who took up a position in a College Chaplaincy – a world that experienced much disruption during the year and which was, for that reason, all the more important to keep in touch with pupils.

We also took advantage during the lockdown to complete several repairs or replacements that were long overdue in our premises.

We had many enquiries from young and less than young people enquiring about our way of life, one of whom spent a couple of weeks with us.

We hope that the coming year brings more normality to our mission, but we were already amazed at just how much it was possible to undertake via modern technology.
