All repairs and upkeep of the 6 Flats carried out and any problems the Residents had were addressed and resolved. It is fair to say the Trustees carried out their responsibilities for the management of Marder with due diligence and care. They provided 6 low cost and well maintained Flats for the use of people from Lyme Regis.

Regards the income and expenditure this was always under survey. There was always a reserve to fall back on as the unexpected can always occur,

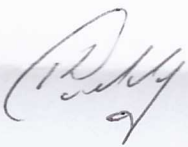
The monthly book-keeping by the Trust's Accountant ensures that the financial status is always under control.

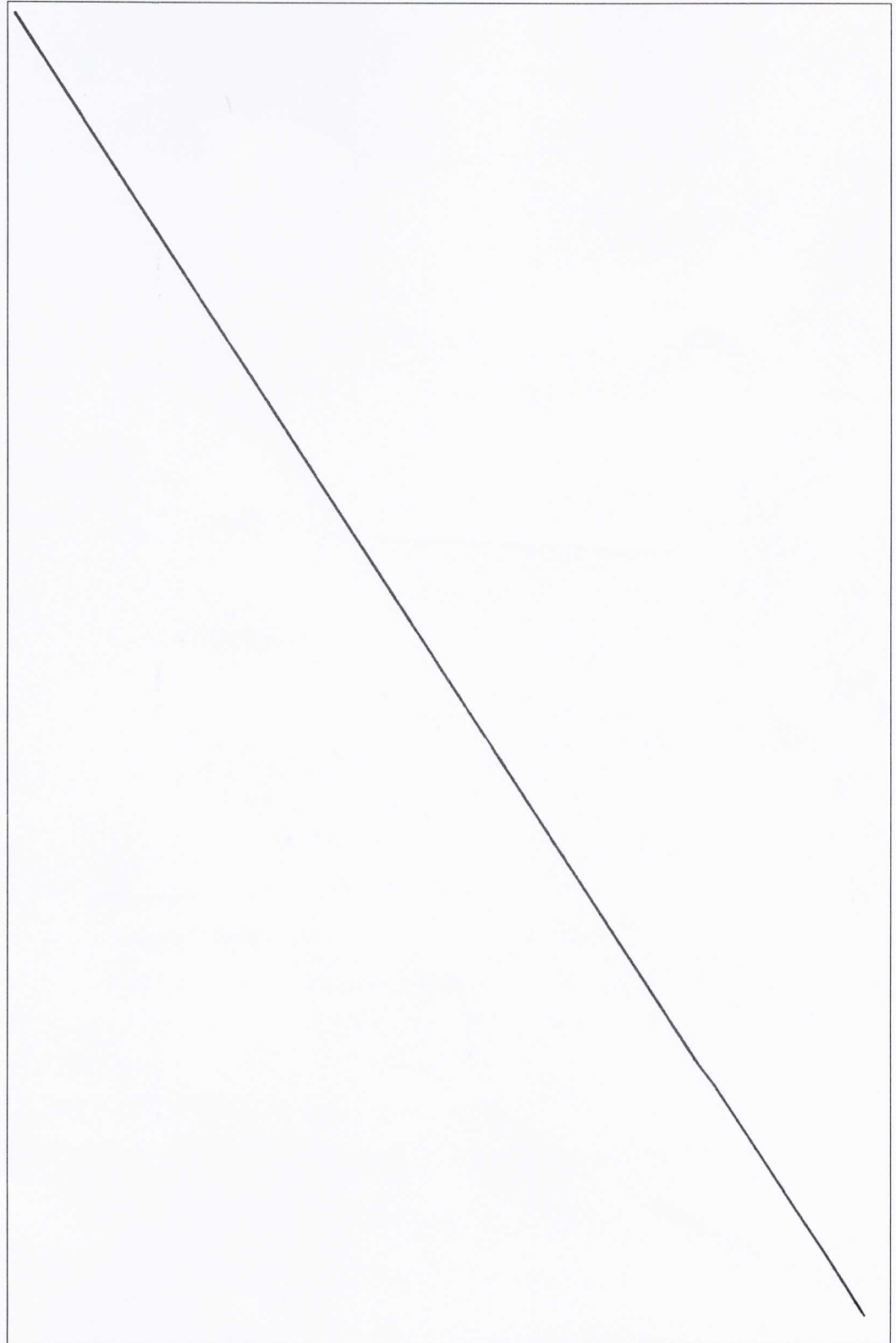

The aim of the Charity is to provide low cost accommodation for people who live in Lyme Regis. Having a connection with the sea would give applicants an advantage. However, all applicants are considered on their own merits and individual circumstances.

The Charity derives income from the weekly Maintenance Charge, interest from the Bank and interest from its investment with M&G Investments.

The Five Year Survey was carried out this year. No major problems reported.

Work that was highlighted has been carried out and more will be done as required and needed.

It proves to be a great advantage to employ, where possible, local tradesmen and to ensure that money is paid when it is due.

It seems somewhat repetitive to say yet again that the Trustees carry out their duties and control of finance in their usual sensible and diligent way.

I am happy to report a successful year for both the Residents and Trustees.

It is important that we always remember that the important people are the Residents.

and the Current Account at over	£10,000.00

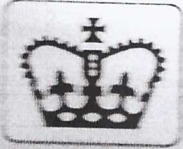
M&G Investment does not seem to have performed as well as recent years. It may be to our advantage to speak to them. I hope to have more up to date figures at our March Meeting.

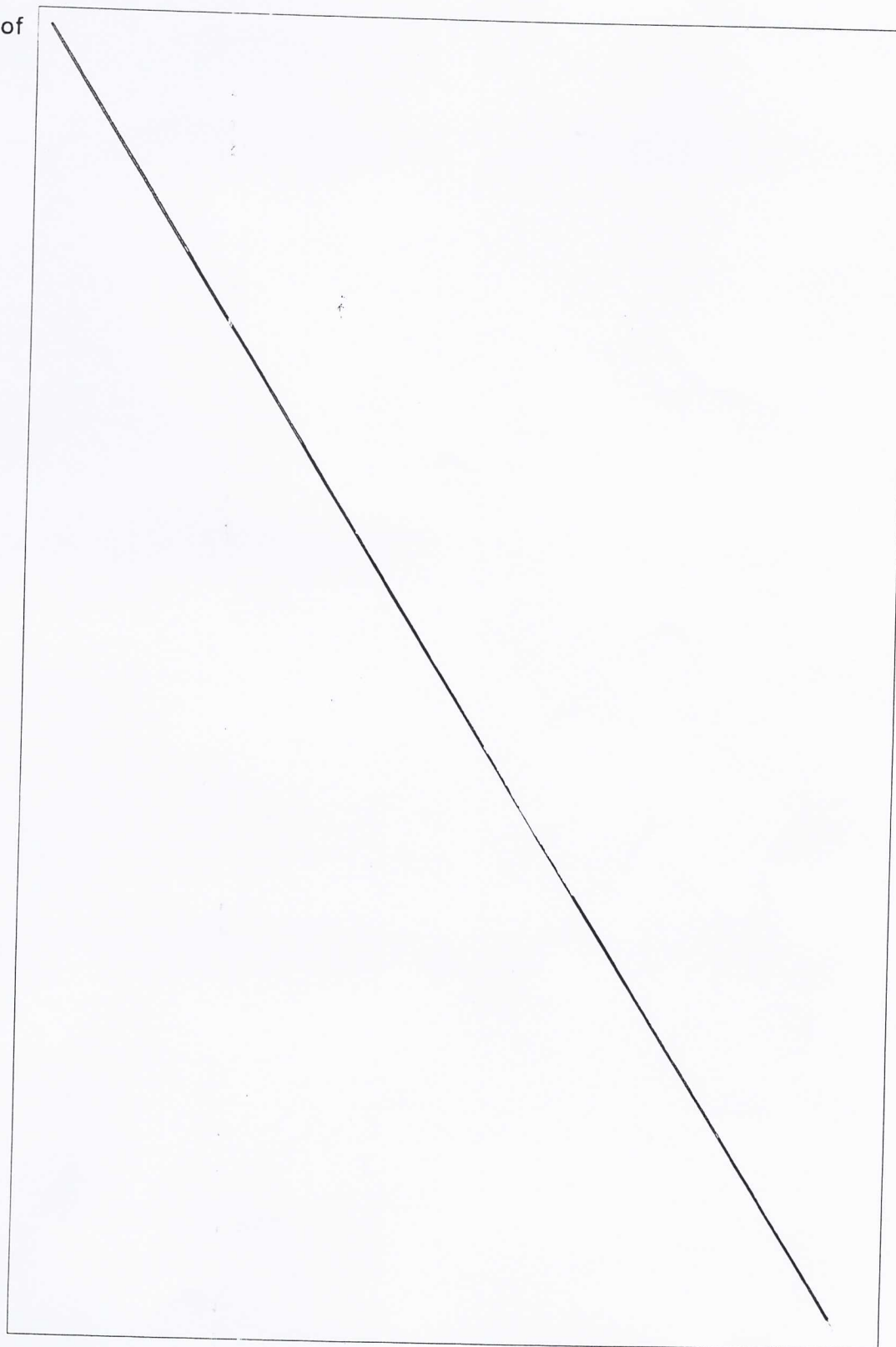

Another year dominated by COVID. The Residents of Marder have come through the situation very well indeed.

All repairs and surveys were carried out. The firms involved carried out their work in a very professional manner in the way they dealt with COVID.

One issue that needs to be highlighted is '**Care in the Community**'. One resident had home care for all of 18 (eighteen) months and was then moved into hospital and then into a care home. Time spent in care home came to nearly twelve (12) months. The main problem for the Trustees was a lack of information from the family and Social Services.

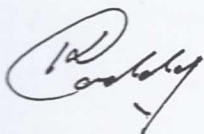
No Weekly Maintenance Charges were lost during this time but it was a long period for the flat to be empty. Trustees feel this is an issue that needs to be amended.

No major developments or improvements were carried out due mainly to the restrictions that COVID produced. Basic upkeep and surveys were the main items of expenditure.

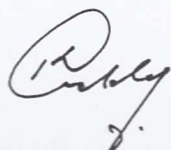
The financial status of the Trust is very sound.

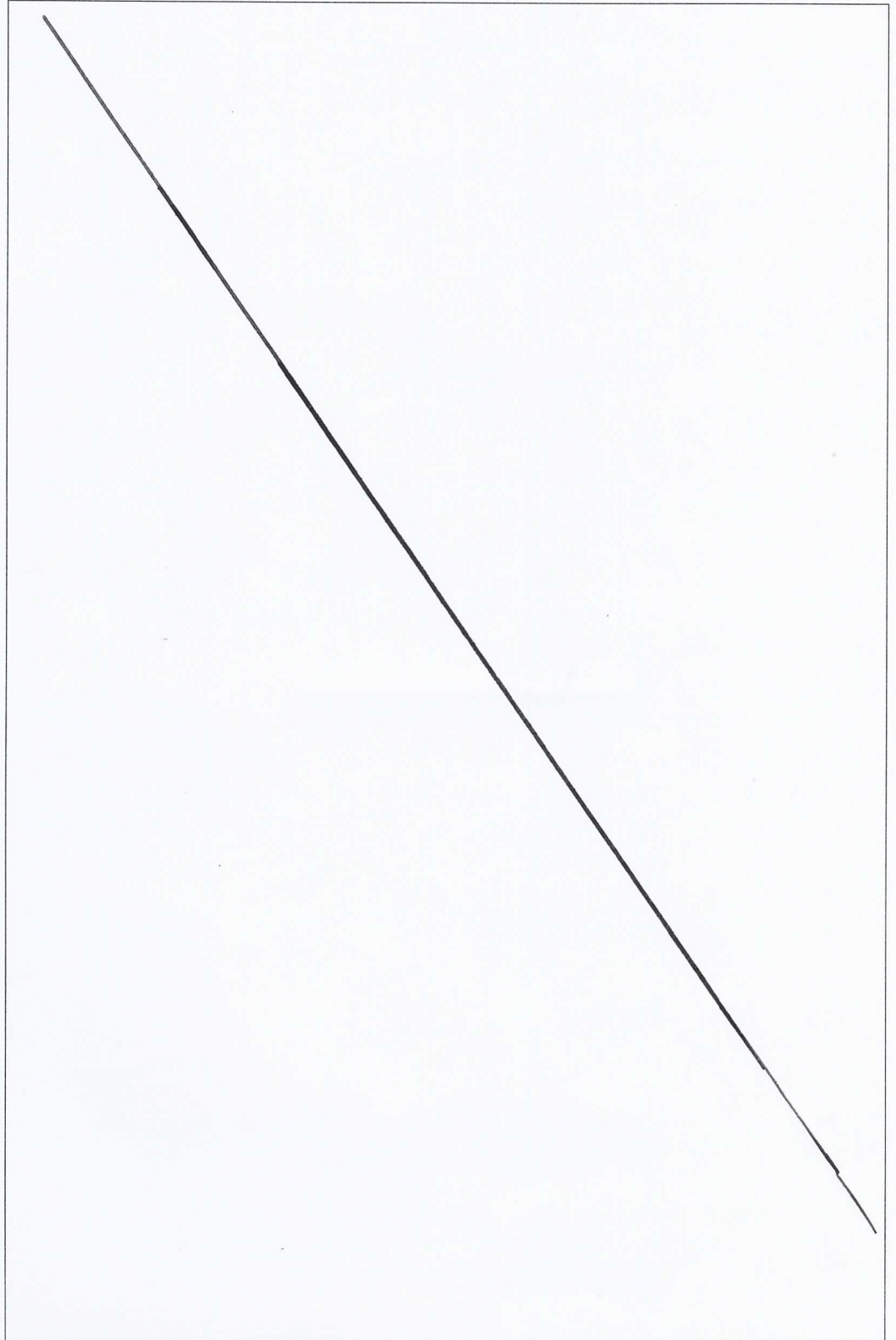
