Trustees Report and Accounts for the Year Ended 31 March 2025

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRSSE) 2015

Structure, Governance and Management:

The Trust was constituted by Deed of Trust dated 31 January 1964 and is governed under the terms of that Deed. The Trust is managed by a Board of Trustees who are responsible for the strategic direction of the Trust and establishing policy. The Board of Trustees meets 3 times a year or on any other occasion as Trust matters require.

The Trustees hold the Trust Fund to apply the income and capital thereof in such manner as they shall in their absolute discretion think fit for all or any of the following purposes:-

The preservation, repair, maintenance, improvement, upkeep, beautification and re-construction of churches in the United Kingdom and of monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass, furniture, ornaments and chattels in such churches, and of the churchyard belonging to such churches.

Public Benefit:

Trustees are aware of the requirement placed upon them by the Charities Act 2011 to demonstrate compliance with Section 4 dealing with "public benefit". The Trust's aim falls within two definitions of charitable activity, the advancement of religion and the advancement of heritage. On each count, the Trust provides benefits to the public generally. The direct beneficiaries of the Trust's support are the parishes and congregations that are responsible for churches, chapels and meeting houses in Leicestershire or the Diocese of Leicester. The Trust raises money for the restoration and improvement of churches, chapels and meeting houses which are used for Christian worship and makes no discrimination between denominations. Applications for grants are supported by written applications using a standard online form and are evaluated by the Grants Administrator before consideration in detail at a meeting of the Trustees. Applications are sometimes reviewed during visits to the scene of the proposed works. It is clear that the work of the Trust benefits those members of the public that make use of these places of worship, either for worship or to enjoy and admire the buildings, the majority of which are of historic and architectural significance. Or to attend a community event in the buildings.

Achievements and Performance:

The main fund raising each year is a sponsored Ride + Stride event which raised £43,818 inclusive of Gift Aid (2024- £36,455). Some income generated for Ride + Stride, made via Just Giving, may have included donations in memory of Graham Wright or for the 60th Anniversary.

Grants, gifts and donations received during the year amounted to £9,834 (2024 - £12,319). Grants allocated to churches during the year amounted to £51,500 (2024 - £23,250).

Reserves Policy:

The Trustees keep an uncommitted reserve of around £40,000, which amount is reviewed annually and deposited in a separate account with CCLA.

Grant Making Policy:

Trustees meet to consider grant applications in Spring and Autumn each year. Trustees accept grant applications for projects costing at least £5,000 (including fees and all VAT) from churches, chapels and meeting houses in Leicester and Leicestershire that

- (a) are used for regular public worship
- (b) belong to the Church of England or any other Christian religious body
- (c) were built more than 50 years ago
- (d) were built more recently than 50 years ago and are listed buildings

1. The Trust contributes towards work to repair, restore or preserve the fabric and aims to support such work as generously as its funds allow.
2. The Trust can consider applications for: roof alarms; the repair or renewal of heating systems where improved heating will benefit the fabric of the building; disabled access; toilet facilities; re-ordering projects which will improve the use of the church by the community, including AV improvements; and essential electrical works.
3. The Trust can consider applications for the repair of fittings, fixtures, stained glass, monuments, furniture, clocks, ornaments and chattels of churches and chapels, and of churchyards (so long as the churchyard is visually part of the setting of the church and under the responsibility of the Church/Chapel Council, and also open for burials).
4. The Trust does not consider applications for redecorating (except where this is necessary following repairs), or for school or other ancillary buildings. The Trust does not normally support improvements that require an extension.

Risk Management:

The Trustees are required under the Charities SORP 2015 to confirm as part of its report that they have reviewed and taken steps to mitigate the major risks to the Trust and an annual review of risk so as to ensure that the measures taken are adequate.

Accounting policies

Resources expended are included in the statement of financial activities on an accruals basis. The cost of grants that have been awarded but not yet paid out are accrued in the accounts. Churches have up to 3 years to claim a grant.

Investments

Investments are stated at the market value at the Balance Sheet date.

Structure, Governance and Management:

The Trust was constituted by Deed of Trust dated 31 January 1964 and is governed under the terms of that Deed. The Trust is managed by a Board of Trustees who are responsible for the strategic direction of the Trust and establishing policy. The Board of Trustees meets 3 times a year or on any other occasion as Trust matters require.

The Trustees hold the Trust Fund to apply the income and capital thereof in such manner as they shall in their absolute discretion think fit for all or any of the following purposes:-

The preservation, repair, maintenance, improvement, upkeep, beautification and re-construction of churches in the United Kingdom and of monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass, furniture, ornaments and chattels in such churches, and of the churchyard belonging to such churches.

Public Benefit:

Trustees are aware of the requirement placed upon them by the Charities Act 2011 to demonstrate compliance with Section 4 dealing with "public benefit". The Trust's aim falls within two definitions of charitable activity, the advancement of religion and the advancement of heritage. On each count, the Trust provides benefits to the public generally. The direct beneficiaries of the Trust's support are the parishes and congregations that are responsible for churches, chapels and meeting houses in Leicestershire or the Diocese of Leicester. The Trust raises money for the restoration and improvement of churches, chapels and meeting houses which are used for Christian worship and makes no discrimination between denominations. Applications for grants are supported by written applications using a standard online form and are evaluated by the Grants Administrator before consideration in detail at a meeting of the Trustees. Applications are sometimes reviewed during visits to the scene of the proposed works. It is clear that the work of the Trust benefits those members of the public that make use of these places of worship, either for worship or to enjoy and admire the buildings, the majority of which are of historic and architectural significance.

Achievements and Performance:

The main fund raising each year is a sponsored Ride & Stride event which raised £33,650 inclusive of Gift Aid (2022 - £35,236).

Grants, gifts and donations received during the year amounted to £7,795 (2022 - £16,218). Grants allocated to churches during the year amounted to £30,650 (2022 - £30,000).

Reserves Policy:

The Trustees keep an uncommitted reserve of around £40,000, which amount is reviewed annually and deposited in a separate account with CCLA.

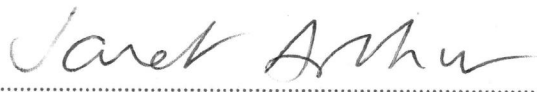

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2021

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2021. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRSSE) 2015.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Trust was constituted by Deed of Trust dated 21st January 1964 and is governed under the terms of that Deed. The Trust is managed by a Board of Trustees who are responsible for the strategic direction of the Trust and establishing policy. The Board of Trustees meets half yearly or on any other occasion as Trust matters require.

The Trustees hold the Trust Fund to apply the income and capital thereof in such manner as they shall in their absolute discretion think fit for all or any of the following purposes:-

The preservation, repair, maintenance, improvement, upkeep, beautification and reconstruction of churches in the United Kingdom and of monuments, fittings, fixtures, stained glass, furniture, ornaments and chattels in such churches, and of the churchyard belonging to such churches.

Public Benefit

Trustees are aware of the requirement placed upon them by the Charities Act 2011 to demonstrate compliance with Section 4 dealing with "public benefit". The Trust's aim falls within two definitions of charitable activity, the advancement of religion and the advancement of heritage. On each count, the Trust provides benefits to the public generally. The direct beneficiaries of the Trust's support are the parishes and congregations that are responsible for churches, chapels and meeting-houses in Leicestershire or the Diocese of Leicester. The Trust raises money for the restoration and improvement of churches, chapels and meeting houses which are used for Christian worship and makes no discrimination between denominations. Applications for grants are supported by written applications using a standard online form and are evaluated by the Grants Administrator before consideration in detail at a meeting of the Trustees. Applications are sometimes reviewed during visits to the scene of the proposed works. It is clear that the work of the Trust benefits those members of the public that make use of these places of worship, either for worship or to enjoy and admire the buildings, the majority of which are of historic and architectural significance.

Achievements and performance

The main fund raising each year is a sponsored Ride & Stride event which raised £37,902 inclusive of Gift Aid (2020 - £42,642).

Grants, gifts and donations received during the year amounted to £8,765 (2020 - £7,140). Grants allocated to churches during the year amounted to £39,650 (2020 - £60,000).

Reserves policy

The Trustees keep an uncommitted reserve of around £40,000, which amount is reviewed annually and deposited in a separate bank account.

Grant making policy

Trustees meet to consider grant applications in Spring and Autumn each year. Trustees accept grant applications for projects costing at least £5,000 (including fees and all VAT) from churches, chapels and meeting houses in Leicester and Leicestershire that

- a) are used for regular public worship
 - b) belong to the Church of England or any other Christian religious body
 - c) were built more than 50 years ago
 - d) were built more recently than 50 years ago and are listed buildings
1. The Trust contributes towards work to repair, restore or preserve the fabric and aims to support such work as generously as its funds allow.
 2. The Trust can consider applications for:- roof alarms; the repair or renewal of heating systems where improved heating will benefit the fabric of the building; disabled access; toilet facilities; re-ordering projects which will improve the use of the church by the community, including AV improvements; and essential electrical works.
 3. The Trust can consider applications for the repair of fittings, fixtures, stained glass, monuments, furniture, clocks, ornaments and chattels of churches and chapels, and of churchyards (so long as the churchyard is visually part of the setting of the church and under the responsibility of the Church/Chapel Council, and also open for burials).
 4. The Trust does not consider applications for redecorating (except where this is necessary following repairs), or for school or other ancillary buildings. The Trust does not normally support improvements that require an extension.

Risk Management

The Trustees are required under the Charities SORP 2015 to confirm as part of its report that they have reviewed and taken steps to mitigate the major risks to which they are exposed. Systems are in place to mitigate the major risks.

The responsibilities of the Trustees cover the identification and assessment of risks; taking appropriate steps to mitigate those highlighted as major risks to the Trust and an annual review of risk so as to ensure that the measures taken are adequate.
