Structure, governance and management

Governing document

The charity was originally formed as a Church in 1909 as the First Church of Christ, Scientist, Sheffield. It was registered with the Charity Commission in 1965 under a declaration of Trust made on 28 September 1960. Under revised By-Laws dated 4 March 2019 the charity changed to the Christian Science Society Sheffield. The Society is a branch of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts and its affairs are governed in accordance with the Manual of The Mother Church and its own By-laws. The demands of the Manual of The Mother Church on a Society are less stringent than those on a Church and compliance is simpler for our small and ageing membership.

Governing body

The Executive Board are the Trustees of the Society and are responsible for its running.

The Executive Board are elected annually in accordance with the Society By-laws. They take up office for one year commencing at the commencement of the Society Year in May.

Objectives and activities

The object of the charity is to demonstrate and publicly present the Truth as set forth in the Bible and interpreted in the Christian Science text book. The main activity of the Society is holding all services and meetings authorised by the Manual of The Mother Church, and the activity of the Reading Room is the provision of public facilities for study, loan and purchase of Christian Science literature and access to Christian Science websites. In planning the activities for the year the Trustees have complied with the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, and in particular the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion.

Achievements and performance - Chairman's statement

The ongoing operation of the Society continues as provided for in the Manual of The Mother Church and in our By-Laws, so far as personnel resources allow. Live, in person, services have been held continuously throughout the year. We continue to support our members and friends as best we can with regular communications by email, text and snail mail. Our members meetings continue to be conducted remotely by email and snail mail. Our consolidated premises in Severn Road have allowed us to start to reach out to those from the surrounding offices and hospitals, who use our entrance steps for lunch breaks. The presence of the Reading Room stock in the Foyer of church means that we have made some sales of stock. We continue to make the Christian Science Sentinel and Journal available as well as the CS Monitor weekly magazine.

We are actively working and praying for more members to enable us to make better use of our abundant financial resources.

The property of the Society is vested in the Official Custodian.

Financial review

The Statement of Financial Activities for the year is set out on page 4. The free reserves of the charity at 31 December 2024, excluding property assets, amounted to £517,121 (2023 £412,899) and these are invested to provide an income to meet the ongoing running costs of the Society.

Grants and donations out of the assets of the charity are shown in note 9 to the financial statements.

Plans for future periods

The Trustees will continue to maintain and make improvements to the premises and the Society plans to continue its activities as described above.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 December 2024

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is 1 Severn Road, Sheffield, S10 2SU.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011, so far as they are applicable to the charity.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a cash basis, adjusted for Reading Room stock and the revaluation of investments, in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the Charities Act 2011.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the opinion of the trustees and management, there are no areas of judgement or key sources of estimation uncertainty that have a significant effect on the financial statements, other than the policies noted below.

Fund accounting

All funds are unrestricted.

Incoming resources

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on a cash basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities

- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

No depreciation has been provided on the Society property as the market value is in excess of cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Society Property	-	Not depreciated
Equipment	-	33% reducing balance
Society Fixtures and fittings	-	25% reducing balance

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly.

Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

Financial instruments

The charity's principal financial instruments comprise bank and building society accounts. Due to the nature of the financial instruments there is no exposure to price or other significant risks.
