Trustees' Report

The trustees present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2025.

Structure, governance and management

Nature of governing document

The Bognor Regis Friends of the Hospitals was formed in 1953 and registered with the Charities Commission on 1st June 1967 (Registration No. 252215). It was formed as an Association under a set of rules drawn up at that time. It is not a Trust and therefore does not have any Trustees, but it is governed by a Committee consisting of a President, Secretary, Treasurer and not less than seven and not more than eleven others from which persons are selected to be Chairman and Vice Chairman for regular meetings usually held every two months. For Charity Commission purposes the committee members are classed as Trustees and are therefore referred to in this report and these accounts as Trustees where appropriate.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

One third of the members of the Committee retire at the end of each Annual General Meeting and are eligible for re-election. The Committee may also elect any members of the Friends to fill vacancies during the year and for those persons to hold office until the next AGM. New Committee members are sought from within the membership or from members of the general public who may be considered to have an interest in the organisation.

Induction and training of trustees

Where new committee members are introduced to the Charity, they are given information regarding the duties of charity trustees, as per the guidance available from the Charity Commission.

Major risks and management of those risks

Risk Management

The Committee from time to time assess the major risks to which the Charity may be exposed and in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity and will continue to try to ensure that the Charity's exposure is mitigated.

At each two monthly meeting the Committee review the financial position of the Charity with the aid of a statement from the Treasurer showing income and expenditure during the previous period from the end of the last financial year and consider fundraising initiatives from within the Committee or suggestions from outside the organisation, and, dependent on funds available, consider applications from the hospital authorities for expenditure on items for which Charity was set up originally.

Objectives and activities

Objects and aims

The Objects of the Charity are to provide patients in the hospital with comforts and amenities including facilities, buildings and equipment which cannot be met through the National Health Service, and also in certain circumstances to subscribe towards specialised equipment located at other hospitals but which serve the surrounding communities.

During the forthcoming year, the Committee will continue to consider all applications for funding based on the above premises. To that end subscriptions will continue, fundraising through the Annual Fete and Summer Raffle will be effected as well as the likely receipts of donations from grateful patients and others.

Objectives, strategies and activities

The committee has continued to receive and consider many propositions for improvements and equipment for the Hospital that are not available through the NHS organisation, and virtually every case, after debate, has been approved with the benefits being much in evidence in the hospital. The hospital departments continue to bring forward projects. Other projects were identified by or continued by the Trustees, in particular by our Chairman.

Public benefit

The Charity's primary activity is to make funds available to the Bognor Regis War Memorial Hospital as and when the NHS Trust requires equipment or works not covered by the Trust's jurisdiction.

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of Section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

The Trustees have considered their duty to have regard to the Public Benefit guidance issued by the Charity Commission in relation to the objectives and actions of the charity. The Trustees consider that the charity does act in a beneficial way to the public and will continue to do so.

Achievements and performance

The committee has continued to receive and consider many propositions for improvements and equipment for the hospital that are not available through the NHS organisation, and virtually every case, after debate, has been approved with the benefits being much in evidence in the hospital. During the last 12 months the Charity has funded or committed to funding, amongst other projects:

- (a) Over £60,000 for a new ultrasound machine
- (b) Over £14,000 for a new bike store for staff
- (c) Over £1,750 for insulated lids for patient meals

Across all projects, a total of almost £89,000 has been spent and just over £38,000 is committed for projects that should be delivered in the 2025-26 year.

Financial review

Policy on reserves

The Trustees intend to continue maintaining funds of a minimum of £100,000 to enable us to meet most requirements without delay and where the NHS cannot provide. The question of risk to our funds is constantly before us, but the difficulty in finding suitable acceptable alternatives in which to invest is something of which committee members are always aware and we remain open to appropriate sensible suggestions.

Principal funding sources

As mentioned in previous reports, legacies have been the main source of substantial income for some years, but there are indications that these have now tailed off and although we have been very fortunate to receive £4,000 in legacies this year, the Charity may not be so lucky in future years. The Charity cannot rely on such support and is therefore reliant on donations and fundraising efforts for the future.

Investment policy and objectives

We hold cash savings through the Flagstone savings platform, with all deposits made within the Financial Services Compensation Scheme limits. This enables us to achieve some of the highest rates of interest available for cash deposits.

Plans for future periods

Aims and key objectives for future periods

The Trustees remain committed to a fair amount of expenditure on items that are not available through NHS sources.

Chairman's Comments

The year started in the customary way with the Annual Christmas Buffet lunch in Marion's for the staff and volunteers which, due to alterations being made within the restaurant area due to start in January, could well be the last to be held in this location.

Due to the building work we held our March meeting in the Chapel and July meeting in the reception area of the Centurion Wing of the hospital. We welcomed a new Trustee in July - Margaret Andrews.

The annual summer fete was a success with entertainment by the MusicSmart Choir, Suzanne School of Dancing and the RAFA Skiffle band, we are indebted to our compere and provider of the sound equipment, Malcolm Gray of Chichester Hospital Radio. The fete raised £9,958.79 including the raffle, which as always was well supported by the local traders donating prizes which totalled some 38 in number.

The tea bar and ward trolley has again provided a valuable service to patients, visitors and staff and provided an income to the Charity of over £11,000 under the management of June Lawrence.

We have committed £88,777.19 to services and equipment this year and already have further requests for funding.

I must thank all the volunteers for the time they devote to The Friends during this year.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the trustees' report and the financial statements in accordance with the United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) and applicable law and regulations.

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008, and the provisions of the constitution. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website. Legislation governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 October 2025

1. Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the second edition of the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Basis of preparation

The Bognor Regis Friends of the Hospitals meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Income and endowments

Voluntary income including donations, gifts, legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donations and legacies

Donations and legacies are recognised on a receivable basis when receipt is probable and the amount can be reliably measured.

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Raising funds

These are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income, the management of investments and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Where they exist, restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
