## **TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2024**

The Trustees submit their annual report and the financial statements of Cambridge Christadelphian Ecclesia (the Charity) for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September 2024. The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### **Policies and Objectives**

Our Ecclesia (or Church) is a member of the worldwide grouping known as "Christadelphians" who believe the Bible to be the inspired word of God, and whose aim is to follow the teachings and example of Jesus Christ. The Ecclesia is composed of members who have been baptised into Christ by full immersion in water following confession of their faith, as defined in the Christadelphian Statement of Faith (known as the BASF).

The Trustees may apply the income of the Charity to external charities or for charitable purposes in order to further the objectives of the Cambridge Christadelphian Ecclesia.

The objective of the Ecclesia is to meet for worship, fellowship, Bible study, preaching, teaching and recreation. These activities, together with the upkeep of our premises, are funded almost entirely by the members of the Ecclesia. It is our policy not to seek donations from outside the Christadelphian Community, although occasional donations for worthy causes are accepted from non-Christadelphians who regularly participate in our activities. On occasion, we raise money from the public on behalf of other charities (such as Macmillan).

#### **Activities for Achieving Objectives**

Meetings, educational materials, and refreshments used at our events are offered free of charge to the General Public. We hold regular Public Bible Talks in person or online and are very keen to provide activities for children and young people from within the Ecclesia and from the local community, via our Sunday School, and Youth Group.

### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

#### **Review of Activities**

During the year we held our regular Breaking of Bread services and public Bible talks at the Hall. Our Bible Class alternates between being on line and in person at the Hall and other activities are often on line to reduce the travelling involved.

This year, we have met and got to know more local Iranian Asylum seekers who are waiting for their cases to be decided. We have continued to provide them with a weekly meal and read the Bible with them. A further 5 of them have been baptised into Christ as members during the year and they have greatly benefitted from fellowship with us. We also transferred a number of Iranian members to other Christadelphian Ecclesias in UK, after they were moved and granted asylum.

We have continued to raise money from our members contributions for worthy causes such as overseas missionary work, support for care homes for the elderly, preaching activities and also for local charities (such as refugee and homeless support).

**STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

**Record Keeping and method of appointment or election of Trustees**

The records of our monthly meetings of the Trustees Committee (Arranging Committee) and quarterly meetings of the Ecclesia are kept, the latter being approved by the members. The members of the committee chair these meetings in rotation. All members of the committee are elected by a majority in a two-yearly ballot of members.

**Trustees' Responsibilities Statement**

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).
