During the 2020/21 year the society ensembles were unable to undertake rehearsals or concerts due to the Covid restrictions. It is hoped that activities can resume in full in the following year. The orchestra welcomes new players, although membership may be subject to audition and vacancies. The chorus is open to all keen singers without audition.


Independent examiner's statement
